1	A JOINT MEMORIAL
2	REQUESTING THE PUBLIC REGULATION COMMISSION TO WORK WITH THE
3	TELECOMMUNICATIONS INDUSTRY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING
4	REGULATION THAT CONFORMS TO AN INCREASINGLY COMPETITIVE
	MARKETPLACE.
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6	WHEREAS, the telecommunications industry has undergone significant
7	changes over the past decade; and
8	WHEREAS, the amount of competition in telecommunications markets has
9	steadily grown, despite the downturn in the economy and in the fortunes of many
10	individual telecommunications companies; and
11	WHEREAS, there exists a wide disparity in the regulation of
	telecommunications companies offering the same or similar services to customers in
12	New Mexico, which affects the ability of companies to employ New Mexicans and to
13	invest in the state; and
14	WHEREAS, the success or failure of competitive services should be
15	determined by the marketplace but is often influenced by outdated regulation; and
16	WHEREAS, the public regulation commission has stated its preference to
17	address, within the framework of regulatory proceedings rather than within legislation,
18	a new form of regulation of the state's largest telecommunications incumbents that is
	more responsive to market conditions; and
19	WHEREAS, the public regulation commission has successfully established an
20	investment and quality-of-service plan, in cooperation with New Mexico's two largest
21	telecommunications incumbents, that has resulted in significant improvements in
22	telecommunications infrastructures and services within the state;
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
24	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the public regulation commission be requested to work
25	with the telecommunications industry, the public and other interested parties to
	establish, before January 1, 2004, a streamlined review process for

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1	telecommunications services that are or are becoming competitive and a new
2	regulatory standard that builds toward more equitable regulation among providers of
3	the same or similar telecommunications services and allows a greater degree of
4	flexibility for the more regulated companies to respond to changing market conditions;

5	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the public regulation commission provide
6	updates of its progress, conclusions and recommendations to the appropriate interim
7	legislative committee and to the governor during 2003; and
8	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the
9	public regulation commission, the governor and the attorney general.
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
