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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
18	"AMBER Alert Law".
19	Section 2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the AMBER Alert Law:
20	A. "AMBER alert" means a declaration by the
21	authorized requester that an abduction has occurred and that
22	notifications and broadcasts should be made pursuant to the
23	AMBER alert notification plan;
24	B. "authorized requester" means the person
25	designated by the chief of the state police to implement the
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1 AMBER alert notification plan;

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"chief of the state police" means the director **C**. of the New Mexico state police division of the department of 3 4 public safety;

D. "lead station" means an AM radio station that has agreed to assist the state police in the implementation of the AMBER alert notification plan and to broadcast AMBER alerts pursuant to that plan; and

"state police" means the New Mexico state police 9 **E**. 10 division of the department of public safety.

Section 3. STATE POLICE--AMBER ALERT NOTIFICATION PLAN--DECLARATION OF AMBER ALERT. --

The state police shall develop and implement an A. AMBER alert notification plan for the purpose of disseminating, as rapidly as possible, information about a child abduction so that law enforcement agencies and citizens throughout the state may be aware and vigilant. The plan shall:

provide a procedure for notifying lead (1) stations by the authorized requester that an AMBER alert has been declared. The procedure shall include codes for use by the authorized requestor in communicating with a lead station to prevent false alerts;

(2) provide that a lead station shall broadcast the alert every thirty minutes for at least eight hours unless notified by the authorized requester that the

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alert has been terminated;

2 (3) include a procedure for notifying the radio communications bureau of the communications division of 3 the general services department that an AMBER alert has been 4 The bureau shall immediately transmit the 5 declared. notification and related information to all state field 6 7 operations employees so that they may be aware and vigilant in the course of their regular activities; 8

9 (4) include a procedure for notifying all
10 local law enforcement agencies that an AMBER alert has been
11 declared; and

(5) provide for dissemination of information about a child or a child's abductor to lead stations, the radio communications bureau and local law enforcement agencies when an AMBER alert has been declared.

B. The chief of the state police shall select one or more lead stations that broadcast to a large portion of New Mexico and that have agreed to assist the state police in broadcasting an AMBER alert pursuant to the AMBER alert notification plan.

C. The state police shall distribute the AMBER alert notification plan to all local law enforcement agencies and provide such training and other assistance as is necessary to ensure that the plan can be properly implemented.

D. The authorized requester may declare an AMBER . 143399.1

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1 alert when the requester has reason to believe that: 2 (1) a child under the age of eighteen has been abducted by an unrelated person; 3 (2)the child is in imminent danger of serious 4 bodily harm or death; and 5 (3) there is specific information available 6 7 about the child or the child's abductor that may assist in an expedient and successful end to the abduction. 8 Once an AMBER alert has been declared, only the 9 **E**. 10 authorized requester may terminate the AMBER alert. Section 4. AMBER ALERT--INITIATION BY OTHER LAW 11 12 ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES. --A. If a law enforcement agency, other than the 13 state police, desires that an AMBER alert be declared, it shall 14 notify the authorized requester. The authorized requester 15 shall declare an AMBER alert if, after evaluating the 16 information, the authorized requester believes that the 17 criteria for declaring an alert has been satisfied. 18 The procedures for initiating an AMBER alert 19 **B**. 20 pursuant to the AMBER Alert Law are available to all law enforcement agencies in New Mexico; provided that nothing in 21 that law prohibits a local law enforcement agency from 22 developing and implementing its own similar notification plan; 23 provided further that nothing in that act supercedes a 24 provision or procedure in such a local notification plan. 25
