19	A. [No individual] <u>A person</u> shall <u>not</u> engage in the
20	occupation or trade of journeyman unless he holds a certificate
21	of competence issued by the division for the occupation or
22	trade in which he desires to engage.
23	B. The [division shall issue] <u>categories for</u>
24	certificates of competence [for] <u>are:</u> journeyman
25	[electricians] <u>electrician</u> , journeyman [plumbers] <u>plumber</u> ,

journeyman gas [fitters] fitter, journeyman pipe [fitters] <u>fitter</u>, journeyman sheet metal [workers] worker, journeyman boiler [operators] operator, residential wireman and journeyman [welders] welder working on pipelines, collection lines or compressor stations.

C. An applicant for a certificate of competence shall [pass] be required to take an examination approved and adopted by the division as to his knowledge of the orders <u>and</u> rules [and regulations] governing the occupation or trade for which a certificate is sought, and [he shall also be examined] as to his technical knowledge and ability pertaining to his particular trade. The examination may be oral, written or demonstrative or any combination thereof, as required by [regulations] rules of the commission [provided that].

<u>D.</u> The division shall issue a certificate of competence to any journeyman welder working on pipelines, collection lines or compressor stations who shows evidence of having satisfactorily completed an examination administered by an independent testing organization or public utility employing engineers registered with the state, such examination meeting the minimum pipeline safety standards set by the [state corporation] <u>public regulation</u> commission.

 $[\underline{P}, -]$ <u>E</u>. Applications for certificates of competence shall be in the form and shall contain such information and attachments as the division prescribes.

 $[E_{\cdot}]$ F. The division shall establish a reasonable fee for any examination or issuance of certificate of competence.

[F.] G. [No individual] A person is not eligible to take an examination for a certificate of competence unless he has had two years' experience in the occupation or trade for 7 which a certificate of competence is sought, or the equivalent 8 thereof as determined by the commission, or has successfully 9 completed a course in the trade approved by the vocational education division of the state department of public education.

H. Employment of an apprentice working under the direct supervision of a certified journeyman is not prohibited by the Construction Industries Licensing Act.

I. A person is eligible to take an examination for a journeyman electrician certificate of competence after at least:

(1) four years of accredited training in the electrical trade:

(2) four years of apprenticeship in the electrical trade; or (3) four years of practical experience in the electrical trade, of which two years are in the commercial trade, industrial trade or the equivalent as determined by the

commission.
