AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN; CREATING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY METHODS TO DIVERT CHILDREN FROM A LIFE OF CRIME; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. TASK FORCE CREATED -- MEMBERSHIP -- DUTIES. --

A. The children, youth and families department shall establish a task force to study programs that serve to divert children from a life of crime.

B. The task force shall include a representative of the state department of public education; two representatives of the children, youth and families department; a representative of the department of health; a representative of the human services department; a designee appointed by the supreme court; a representative of the New Mexico municipal league; a representative of the New Mexico association of

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counties; a representative of the county maternal and child health planning council as provided for in the County Maternal and Child Health Plan Act; three public members from interested child-oriented organizations; a representative of the public defender department; and a law enforcement representative. All task force members and the chair shall be appointed by the secretary of children, youth and families.

- C. The task force shall examine programs providing opportunities to divert children from a life of crime, including:
- (1) home visits by child development professionals starting before birth and continuing for the first two years of a child's life;
- (2) training for parents and therapy for families with school-age children who have exhibited inappropriate aggression or otherwise demonstrated unhealthy behavior in school;
- (3) creating incentives, including cash, to induce disadvantaged students to complete their education; and
- (4) monitoring and supervising youth who have exhibited delinquent behavior.
- D. The task force shall make a preliminary report to the legislative education study committee, the corrections oversight and justice committee, the legislative finance committee and the interim legislative health and human services . 145071.3

committee at their respective October 2003 meetings and shall present its final report, including legislative recommendations, to the same committees by October 2004.

Section 2. APPROPRIATION. -- One hundred thirty-five thousand dollars (\$135,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the children, youth and families department for expenditure in fiscal years 2004 and 2005 to support the work of the task force created in Section 1 of this act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2005 shall revert to the general fund.

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
