RELATI NG TO EDUCATI ON; REQUI RI NG ONE UNI T I N NEW MEXI CO LAND GRANT HI STORY AND NATI VE AMERI CAN HI STORY FOR GRADUATI ON; RECONCI LI NG MULTI PLE AMENDMENTS TO THE SAME SECTI ON OF LAW IN LAVS 2001.

BE I T ENACTED BY THE LEGI SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. Section 22-2-8. 4 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1986, Chapter 33, Section 5, as amended by Laws 2001, Chapter 257, Section 1 and by Laws 2001, Chapter 276, Section 1) is amended to read:
"22-2-8.4. GRADUATI ON REQUI REMENTS. --
A. At the end of the ei ghth grade or during the ni nth grade, each student shall prepare an indi vi dual program of study for grades ni ne through twel ve. The program of study shall be si gned by a student's parent or guardi an.
B. Begi nning with students entering the ni nth grade in the [1986-87] 2004-2005 school year, successful compl etion of a minimum of twent $y$-three units shall be requi red for graduation. These units shall be as follows:
(1) four units in English, with maj or emphasis on grammar and literat ure;
(2) three units in mathematics;
(3) t wo units in science, one of whi ch shall have a I abor at ory component;
(4) three units in soci al science, whi ch shall i ncl ude United St at es hi story and geography, world hi story and geogr aphy, and gover nment and economi cs;
(5) one unit in physical [fitness] education;
(6) one unit in communi cation skills, with maj or emphasis on writing and speaking, which may include a I anguage ot her than Engl ish; [and]
(7) one unit in New Mexico I and grant hi story and Native Ameri can hi story; and
[(7) nine] ei ght el ective units. Onl y the following el ective units shall be counted toward meeting the requi rements for graduation: fine arts, i.e., music, band, chorus and art; practical arts; physical education; languages ot her than English; speech; drama; vocational education; mathemati cs; sci ence; English; [R.O.T.C.] reserve officers' training corps; soci al sci ence; computer sci ence; heal th . 145051. 1
education; American sign I anguage; and ot her el ectives approved by the state board.
C. With the approval of the local school board, partici pation in a marching band, on an athlet c teamor in an athl etic sport during the school day may count toward fulfillment of the physical education required unit.
[C.] D. Final examinations shall be admini stered to all students in all classes offered for credit.
[D.] E. No student shall receive a hi gh school di pl ond who has not passed a state graduation exam nation in the subject areas of reading, English, math, writing, science and soci al sci ence. [Beginning with the 1996-97-school year] The state graduation exami nations on soci al sci ence shall include a section on the constitution of the United States and the constitution of New Mexico. If a student exits fromthe school systemat the end of grade twel ve without having passed a state graduation exami nation, he shall recei ve an appropriate state certificate indicating the number of credits earned and the grade completed. If within five years after a student exits from the school system he takes and passes the state graduation examination, he may recei ve a hi gh school di ploma.
E. The state board may establish a policy to provide for administrative interpretations to clarify curricular and testing provisions of the Public School Code."
