RELATI NG TO THE LEGI SLATURE; REDUCI NG THE SI ZE OF THE LEGI SLATI VE FI NANCE COMM TTEE; PROVI DI NG THAT THE CHAI RS OF THE HOUSE EDUCATI ON COMM TTEE AND THE SENATE EDUCATI ON COMM TTEE W LL BE NONVOTI NG ADVI SORY MEMBERS OF THE LEGI SLATI VE FI NANCE COMM TTEE; PROVI DI NG FOR A DESI GNEE TO SERVE AT LEGI SLATI VE FI NANCE COMM TTEE MEETI NGS OR LEGI SLATI VE EDUCATI ON STUDY COMM TTEE MEETI NGS I F A REGULAR MEMBER I S GO NG TO BE ABSENT; LI M TI NG CERTAI N I NTERI M COMM TTEE MEETI NGS OUTSI DE OF THE STATE CAPI TOL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEG SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO: Section 1. Section 2-5-1 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1957, Chapter 3, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
"2-5-1. LEG SLATI VE FI NANCE COMM TTEE CREATED - TERMS- -
A. There is created a continuing joint interim committee of the legislat ure to be desi gnated the "I egi slative finance committee". The committee shall be composed of [sixteen] fifteen menbers, ei ght members fromthe house of represent atives and [ eight] seven menbers fromthe senate. The [ Chairmen] chairs of the house appropriations and finance and house taxation and revenue conmittees and the senate finance committee or members of thei r respective committees desi gnated by each of themfromtime to time shall be members. The chairs of the house education committee and the senate education committee or members of their respective committees desi gnated by each of themfromtime to time shall be nonvoting advi sory members. The minority party shall be represented on the committee by at least one menber fromeach house. Six of the remai ning members shall be appointed fromthe house of represent at ives by the speaker, and the [seven] six remai ni ng nembers shall be appoi nted fromthe senate by the committees' committee or, if the appointments are made in the interim by the president pro tempore after consultation with and agreement of a maj ority of the members of the committees' committee. [An appointed menber may designate a menber of his party to serve in his place at a committee meeting at which the] If a regul ar member is going to be absent from a committee meeting, the regular member may desi gnate a legislat or fromthe same house and party to serve in the regul ar member's pl ace at the meeting
if the menber notifies the [ chairman] chair of the legislative finance committee of [his] the antici pated absence and [his] notifies the desi gnee at least twenty-four hours bef ore the committee meeting. The regul ar menber shall sel ect the designee froma list of potential desi gnees appointed by the appointing authority for each house. The list shall be maintai ned in the offices of the legislative finance committee. The appoi nted menbers of the committee shall be appointed from each house so as to give the two political parties having the most nembers in each house the same total proportionate representation on the committee as prevails in that house; provi ded that in the computation, maj or fractions shall be counted as whole numbers. M nority menbers fromthe house shall be appoi nted by the speaker onl y from recommendations made by the minority floor leader, al though the speaker shall ret ai $n$ the right to reject any such recommendations.
B. Mentors shall be appoi nted for terms of two years [and shall serve from the time of their appoint ment until the end of the next session of the legistature]; provided, the termof any member shall terminate when the member ceases to be a member of the I egislat ure.
C. Vacanci es in the committee may be filled for the unexpi red termby appoi nt ment from the house or senate respectivel y by the respective appointing authority that makes the original appointments and subject to the same
recommendations; provi ded the new members shall be from the same house of the legi slature and the same party from whi ch thei $r$ predecessors were appoi nted. The committee shall el ect fromits membership such other officers as may be deemed necessary. The officers shall be appointed for terns cotermin with thei $r$ menbershi $p$ on the committee. Each office shall be alternated between the respective houses each t wo years. [For the terns beginning in 1979, the chairnan shall be a senate menber and the vice chairman, if any, shalt be a house mener.] The appointing authority of each house shall exercise its appointing authority by naming the [ehairman] chai $r$ or vi ce [ehairman] chair, respectivel $y$, on this alternating basis.
D. [ $\mathrm{A} e$ ] An action shall not be taken by the committee if a majority of the total membership fromeither house on the committee rejects the action.
E. The legi slative finance committee shall not meet outside of the state capitol after August 31 of each year wi thout the prior approval of the New Mexico legi slative council."

Section 2. Section 2-10-1 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1971, Chapter 287, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
"2-10-1. CREATI ON OF COMM TTEE- - MEMBERS- - NUMBER- APPOI NTMENT- - TERM OF OFFI CE. - -
A. A permanent $j$ oi nt interim committee of the . 142690.5

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I egi slat ure to be called the "I egi sl ative education study committee" is created. The committee shall be composed of ten menbers, four fromthe senate and six fromthe house. The house education committee and the senate education committee shall be represented. The committee menbers shall be appointed for tho-year terms, whi ch shall expire on the first day of each odd- year session. The termof any member shall terminate when such nember ceases to be a nenber of the legislature. Members shall be appoi nted by the committees' committee of the senate or, if the appoi ntment is made in the interim by the president pro tempore, after consultation with and agreement of a maj ority of the menbers of the committees' committee, and the speaker of the house of represent atives; provi ded, however, min nority menbers shall be appointed by the speaker only from recommendations made by the minority floor leader, al though the speaker shall retain the right to reject any such recommendations. If a regul ar nenber is going to be absent froma committee meeting, the regul ar menber may desi gnate a legi slat or from the same house and party to serve in the regul ar member's place at the meeting if the menber notifies the chai $r$ of the committee of the antici pated absence and the name of the desi gnee at least twenty-four hours bef ore the committee meeting. The regul ar menber shall select the designee froma list of potential desi gnees appointed by the appointing authority for each house. The list shall be . 142690. 5
mai nt ai ned in the offices of the legislative education study committee. Vacancies on the committee shall be filled for the unexpired termby the respective appointing authority [ that makes the origi nal appoi nt ments and subject to the same recommendations, provi ded that menbers shall be appoi nted from the respective houses, parties and committees so as to mai nt ai $n$ the same number of house and senate members and the same representation of standing committees as provided in the origi nal appointments. Each of the two parties having the I argest number of nembers in the legislat ure shall be represented on the committee in proportion to the membershi p of each such party in each house; provi ded that in the computation, maj or fractions shall be counted as whole numbers, and in no event shall either of the two maj or parties have less than one nember fromeach house.
B. The officers shall be appointed for terms coterminous with thei $r$ membershi $p$ on the committee. Each office shall be alternated between the respective houses each t wo years. [For the tern beginning in 1979, the chairnma shall be a house menber and the vice chairman, if any, shall be a senate mentber.] The appointing authority of each house shall exercise its appointing authority by naming the [ chairman] chair or vi ce [ ehairman] chai $r$, respectivel $y$, on this alternating basis.
C. [ Ab ] An action shall not be taken by the
committee if a majority of the total membership fromeither house on the committee rejects such action.
D. The I egi sl ative education study committee shall not meet outside of the state capitol after August 31 of each year without the pri or approval of the New Mexico legi slative council."

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
