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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	Section 1. Section 27-2-12.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1987,
19	Chapter 269, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
20	"27-2-12.3. MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENTEQUAL PAY FOR EQUAL
21	PHYSI CI ANS', DENTI STS', OPTOMETRI STS', PODI ATRI STS',
22	CHIROPRACTIC PHYSICIANS' AND PSYCHOLOGISTS' SERVICES
23	<u>A.</u> The human services department shall establish [$\frac{1}{2}$
24	rate] <u>rates</u> for the reimbursement of physicians, dentists,
25	optometrists, podiatrists, <u>chiropractic physicians</u> and
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1 psychologists for services rendered to medicaid patients [that 2 provides] that are not in the managed care system. The rates 3 shall provide equal reimbursement for the same or similar 4 services rendered without respect to the date on which [such] 5 the physician, dentist, optometrist, podiatrist, chiropractic physician or psychologist entered into practice in New Mexico, 6 7 the date on which the physician, dentist, optometrist, 8 podiatrist, chiropractic physician or psychologist entered into 9 an agreement or contract to provide [such] services or the 10 location in which [such] services are to be provided in the 11 state [provided, however, that the requirements of this section 12 shall not apply when the human services department contracts 13 with entities pursuant to Section 27-2-12.6 NMSA 1978 to 14 negotiate a rate for the reimbursement for services rendered to 15 medicaid patients in the medicaid managed care system].

<u>B.</u> For services rendered to medicaid patients in the medicaid managed care system, the provisions of Section 27-11-6 NMSA 1978 shall apply."

Section 2. Section 27-11-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1998, Chapter 30, Section 1) is amended to read:

"27-11-1. SHORT TITLE.--[This act] Chapter 27, Article 11 <u>NMSA 1978</u> may be cited as the "Medicaid Provider Act"."

Section 3. Section 27-11-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1998, Chapter 30, Section 2) is amended to read:

"27-11-2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Medicaid Provider .144808.1 - 2 -

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Act:

A. "department" means the human services department;

B. "health care professional" means a physician or
other health care practitioner who is licensed, certified or
otherwise authorized by the state to provide health care
services consistent with state law;

[B.] C. "managed care organization" means a person eligible to enter into risk-based prepaid capitation agreements with the department to provide health care and related services;

[C.] <u>D.</u> "medicaid" means the medical assistance program established pursuant to Title 19 of the federal Social Security Act and regulations issued pursuant to that act;

 $[\underline{D}, -] \underline{E}$ "medicaid provider" means a person, including a managed care organization, operating under contract with the department to provide medicaid-related services to recipients;

[E.] F. "person" means an individual or other legal entity;

[F.] <u>G.</u> "recipient" means a person whom the department has determined to be eligible to receive medicaid-related services;

 $[G_{\cdot}]$ <u>H.</u> "secretary" means the secretary of human services; and

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1	[II.] <u>I.</u> "subcontractor" means a person who
2	contracts with a medicaid provider to provide medicaid-related
3	services to recipients."
4	Section 4. A new section of the Medicaid Provider Act,
5	Section 27-11-6 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read:
6	"27-11-6. [<u>NEW MATERIAL]</u> FAIR AND NONDISCRIMINATORY
7	PRACTICES REQUIRED OF MEDICAID PROVIDERSREMEDIES FOR
8	VI OLATI ONS
9	A. In its provision of services to medicaid
10	patients, a medicaid provider:
11	(1) shall not refuse to renew a contract with
12	a health care professional if requested by the health care
13	professional unless the medicaid provider can demonstrate by a
14	preponderance of the evidence that good cause exists for the
15	refusal;
16	(2) shall establish and implement rates of
17	reimbursement for services rendered to medicaid patients that
18	provide equal reimbursement for the same or similar services
19	rendered without respect to the date on which the health care
20	professional entered into practice in New Mexico, the date on
21	which the health care professional entered into a contract to
22	provide the services or the location in which the services are
23	to be provided in the state; and
24	(3) shall not discriminate against a contract
25	health care professional based on the race, ethnicity, gender,

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religious beliefs or sexual orientation of the health care
 professional.

A health care professional that is damaged by a 3 **B**. 4 medicaid provider's failure to comply with provisions of 5 Paragraph (1), (2) or (3) of Subsection A of this section has a civil right of action against the provider for damages, and if 6 7 the health care professional prevails in a suit brought 8 pursuant to this subsection may be awarded: 9 compensatory damages; (1) 10 punitive damages in an amount at least (2)11 three times the award of compensatory damages if the medicaid 12 provider's failure to comply was intentional; 13 a reasonable attorney fee; and (3) 14 (4) costs and expenses incurred in prosecuting 15 the action." 16 EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public Section 5. 17 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately. 18 - 5 -19 20 21 22 23 24 25

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
