19	Section 1. EXECUTIVE REORGANIZATIONEXECUTIVE ORDER

21	A. The governor may, by executive order issued in
22	2003, make the following state agencies cabinet-level
23	departments:
24	(1) the state agency on aging may become the
25	aging and long-term care department;
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1 (2)the office of cultural affairs may become the cultural affairs department; 2 the New Mexico office of Indian affairs 3 (3) may become the Indian affairs department; and 4 (4) the New Mexico veterans' service 5 6 commission may become the veterans' service department. 7 **B**. Functions, personnel, appropriations, money, 8 records, files, furniture, equipment and other property of an 9 agency specified in Subsection A of this section shall be 10 transferred to the resulting department. Contractual and 11 statutory obligations of the original agency shall be 12 obligations of the resulting department. 13 The executive order relating to the state agency С. 14 on aging may provide for the transfer of functions, personnel, 15 appropriations, money, records, files, furniture, equipment, 16 supplies and other property of the children, youth and families 17 department, human services department and department of health 18 pertaining to adult services to the aging and long-term care 19 department. 20 If a special election is held and the voters D. 21 approve a constitutional amendment to create a cabinet-level 22 public education department, the governor may, by executive 23 order issued in 2003, establish the department from the state

department of public education. Upon issuance of the executive order, functions, personnel, appropriations, money, records,

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files, furniture, equipment and other property of the state department of public education shall be transferred to the public education department. Contractual and statutory obligations of the state department of public education shall be obligations of the public education department.

E. If a bill of the forty-sixth legislature, second session, approving an executive reorganization undertaken pursuant to Subsection A and D of this section is not enacted into law, that reorganization is void.

Section 2. APPROPRIATION. -- Two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the office of the governor for expenditure in fiscal year 2004 to carry out the purposes of Section 1 of this act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2004 shall revert to the general fund.

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
