16	Section 1. Section 22-8-25 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1981,
17	Chapter 176, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"22-8-25. STATE EQUALIZATION GUARANTEE DISTRIBUTION
19	DEFINITIONSDETERMINATION OF AMOUNT
20	A. The state equalization guarantee distribution is
21	that amount of money distributed to each school district to
22	ensure that the school district's operating revenue, including
23	its local and federal revenues as defined in this section, is
24	at least equal to the school district's program cost.
25	B. "Local revenue", as used in this section, means

seventy-five percent of receipts to the school district derived from that amount produced by a school district property tax applied at the rate of fifty cents (\$.50) to each one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of net taxable value of property allocated to the school district and to the assessed value of products severed and sold in the school district as determined under the Oil and Gas Ad Valorem Production Tax Act and upon the assessed value of equipment in the school district as determined under the Oil and Gas Production Equipment Ad Valorem Tax Act. The school district shall budget and expend twenty percent of the total revenue receipts for capital outlay.

C. "Federal revenue", as used in this section, means receipts to the school district, excluding amounts that, if taken into account in the computation of the state equalization guarantee distribution, result, under federal law or regulations, in a reduction in or elimination of federal school funding otherwise receivable by the school district, derived from the following:

(1) seventy-five percent of the school district's share of forest reserve funds distributed in accordance with Section 22-8-33 NMSA 1978. The school district shall budget and expend twenty percent of the total forest reserve receipts for capital outlay; and

(2) [seventy-five percent] of grants from the federal government [as] for assistance to those areas affected

1 by federal activity authorized in accordance with Title 20 of the United States Code, commonly known as "PL 874 funds" or 2 "impact aid", seventy-five percent through June 30, 2003; sixty 3 percent from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004; forty-five 4 percent from July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005; thirty percent 5 from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006; fifteen percent from 6 July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007; and zero percent beginning 7 on July 1, 2007 and in subsequent years. The school district 8 9 shall budget and expend twenty percent of the grant receipts 10 for capital outlay.

D. To determine the amount of the state equalization guarantee distribution, the state superintendent shall:

(1) calculate the number of program units to
 which each school district is entitled using an average of the
 MEM on the fortieth, eightieth and one hundred twentieth days
 of the prior year; or

(2) calculate the number of program units to which a school district operating under an approved year-round school calendar is entitled using an average of the MEM on appropriate dates established by the state board; or

(3) calculate the number of program units to which a school district with a MEM of two hundred or less is entitled by using an average of the MEM on the fortieth, eightieth and one hundred twentieth days of the prior year or . 143013.1
