Whoever commits evading an officer shall be **B**. 5 punished as follows: 6

(1)if the highest crime committed by a person who commits evading an officer is a capital or first degree 8 9 felony, the person who commits evading an officer is guilty of a second degree felony;

(2) if the highest crime committed by a person who commits evading an officer is a second degree felony, the person who commits evading an officer is guilty of a third degree felony;

if the highest crime committed by a person (3) who commits evading an officer is a third or fourth degree felony, the person who commits evading an officer is guilty of a fourth degree felony; and

(4) if the highest crime committed by a person who commits evading an officer is a misdemeanor or petty misdemeanor, the person who commits evading an officer is guilty of a petty misdemeanor."

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2003.
