HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION FOR THE PURPOSES OF 2 Section 3. 3 BANKRUPTCY PROCEEDINGS. -- For the purposes of bankruptcy proceedings, a debtor's homestead is exempt from the processes 4 of the bankruptcy court, and no judgment, decree or execution 5 shall be a lien against it in bankruptcy court, except for the 6 payment of taxes, tax assessments or obligations contracted for 7 the purchase, improvement or repair of the homestead. 8 Section 4. LIMITATION OF THE HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION. -- The 9 10 homestead exemption provided in Section 3 of the Homestead Bankruptcy Exception Act is limited to the owner of the 11 12 homestead and his heirs.
