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## AN ACT

RELATI NG TO EDUCATI ON; CHANGI NG GRADUATI ON REQUI REMENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGI SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. Section 22-2-8. 4 NMEA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1986, Chapter 33, Section 5, as amended by Laws 2001, Chapter 257, Section 1 and by Laws 2001, Chapter 276, Section 1) is amended to read:
" 22-2-8. 4. GRADUATI ON REQUI REMENTS. --
A. At the end of the ei ghth grade or during the ni nth grade, each student shall prepare an indi vidual program of study for grades ni ne through twel ve. The program of study shall be si gned by a student's parent or guardian.
B. Begi nning with students entering the ni nth grade in the 1986-87 school year, successful compl etion of a mi mum of twent $y$-three units shall be requi red for graduation. These
units shall be as follows:
(1) four units in English, with maj or emphasis on grammar and liter at ure;
(2) three units in mathematics, one of which shall be in al gebra or a hi gher level mathematics course;
(3) [tol three units in science, one of whi ch shal l have a laboratory component;
(4) three units in soci al science, whi ch shall i ncl ude United States hi story and geography, world hi story and geography, and gover nment and economi cs;
[(5) one unit in physical fitness;
(-6)] (5) one unit in commication skills, with maj or emphasis on writing and speaking, whi ch may incl ude a I anguage ot her than English; and
[(7)] (6) ni ne el ective units. Onl y the following el ective units shall be counted toward meeting the requi rements for graduation: fine arts, i.e., music, band, chorus and art; practical arts; physical education; I anguages ot her than English; speech; drama; vocational education; mathematics; sci ence; English; [R.O.T.C.] reserve officers' trai ni ng corps; soci al sci ence; computer sci ence; heal th education; Ameri can sign I anguage; service learning; and ot her el ectives approved by the state board.

Wth the approval of the local school board, participation on an athletic teamor in an athl etic sport during the school
day may count toward fulfillment of [the] a physical education [required] el ective unit.
C. Final exami nations shall be admi ni stered to all students in all classes offered for credit.
D. [ Ne] A student shall not recei ve a hi gh school di pl ond who has not passed a state graduation exam nation in the subject areas of reading, English, math, writing, science and soci al science. Begi nning with the 1996-97 school year, the state graduation exami nations on social sci ence shall incl ude a section on the constitution of the United States and the constitution of New Mexico. If a student exits fromthe school system at the end of grade twel ve without having passed a state graduation exam nation, he shall receive an appropriate state certificate indicating the number of credits earned and the grade completed. If within five years after a student exits from the school system he takes and passes the state graduation examination, he may recei ve a hi gh school di ploma.
E. The state board may establish a policy to provide for administrative inter pretations to clarify curricular and testing provisions of the Public School Code." - 3 -
