22	<u>A.</u> The [ <del>human services</del> ] department shall establish
23	a rate for the reimbursement of physicians, <u>including doctors</u>
24	of oriental medicine, dentists, optometrists, podiatrists and
25	psychologists for services rendered to medicaid patients that

B. The department shall establish a rate for the reimbursement for acupuncture services that is commensurate with the reasonable and customary rate for acupuncture services charged by doctors of oriental medicine statewide.

<u>C.</u> The requirements of this section shall not apply when the [human services] department contracts with entities pursuant to Section 27-2-12.6 NMSA 1978 to negotiate a rate for the reimbursement for services rendered to medicaid patients in the medicaid managed care system "

Section 2. A new section of the Public Assistance Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] DOCTORS OF ORIENTAL MEDICINE.--The department shall recognize doctors of oriental medicine, licensed pursuant to the Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine Practice Act, as providers in the medicaid managed care system and other medicaid programs for all services within their scope of practice pursuant to that act."

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
