BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

- Section 1. INDIVIDUALS CONVICTED OF A SEXUALLY VIOLENT CRIME IN ANOTHER STATE--PROHIBITED FROM MOVING TO NEW MEXI CO. - -
- Individuals who have been convicted of a sexually violent crime in another state are prohibited from moving to and residing in this state.
- As used in this section, "sexually violent crime" means a criminal offense in another state that is equivalent to:
  - (1) criminal sexual penetration in the first
