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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. A new section of the Municipal Code is enacted
18	to read:
19	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL]</u> ORDINANCE IMPACT STUDIES
20	A. As used in this section:
21	(1) "land use" means issues relating to
22	infrastructure such as roads, water and utilities; affordable
23	housing requirements; open space requirements; and any other
24	requirements related to the development of land; and
25	(2) "municipality" means a municipality with a
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population greater than sixty thousand according to the most recent federal decennial census.

A municipality shall publish an "ordinance B. impact study" every five years on the cumulative effect of land use ordinances, master plans and other regulations on the housing industry. The municipality shall pay for the study from its general fund.

8 The municipality shall appoint a committee to C. 9 determine the requirements of the ordinance impact study. The 10 committee shall include representatives of builders and contractors, municipal land use staff, home owners, affordable 12 housing specialists, realtors, appraisers, financial 13 institutions, environmental organizations and the department of 14 finance and administration."

Section 2. A new section of Chapter 4, Article 37 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] CLASS A COUNTIES--ORDINANCE IMPACT STUDIES. - -

As used in this section, "land use" means issues Α. relating to infrastructure such as roads, water and utilities; affordable housing requirements; open space requirements; and any other requirements related to the development of land.

B. A class A county shall publish an "ordinance impact study" every five years on the cumulative effect of land use ordinances, master plans and other regulations on the . 144054. 1

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housing industry. The county shall pay for the study from its
 general fund.

3 C. The county shall appoint a committee to 4 determine the requirements of the ordinance impact study. The 5 committee shall include representatives of builders and contractors, county land use staff, home owners, affordable 6 7 housing specialists, realtors, appraisers, financial 8 institutions, environmental organizations and the department of 9 finance and administration." 10 Section 3. DELAYED REPEAL. -- Sections 1 and 2 of this act 11 are repealed July 1, 2013. 12 Section 4.
