18	ENFORCEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION DUTIESThe state highway and
19	transportation department shall:
20	A. establish within the department an office of
21	highway litter control. Such office shall be charged with the
22	administration and enforcement of the Clean Highways Act and
23	shall supervise designated personnel within each of the highway
24	district offices who shall implement litter control programs
25	within that district; [and]
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1 **B**. institute through the office of highway litter 2 control a continuous and aggressive litter control program on the roads and highways of this state, which shall include: 3 4 the hiring of special litter removal crews (1) 5 composed of unemployed, underemployed and young persons to regularly police litter from the roads and highways of this 6 7 state and the rights of way of such roads and highways; 8 provided, that in employing such persons, the department shall 9 give strong consideration to the unemployed and underemployed 10 levels in each highway district; 11 (2)[initiate] the initiation and [supervise] 12 supervision of litter removal and collection programs by civic 13 groups, youth organizations and summer vacation students, [and 14 to provide] providing a method of reimbursement to such groups

and persons based on the number of pounds of such litter removed from the roads and highways and [to assist] assisting such removal whenever possible by the use of available state highway and transportation department vehicles;

(3) the design and installation of appropriate
signs along the roads and highways urging the traveling public
to observe proper litter control;

(4) the design and furnishing of litter control bags for the traveling public bearing a statewide litter symbol and a statement of the penalties provided by law for littering, such bags to be distributed at rest stops, ports .144824.1

2	has access; and
3	(5) the providing of additional litter control
4	receptacles at appropriate places along the roads and highways
5	of this state and [for] the regular and periodic removal and
6	collection of litter from such receptacles; and
7	<u>C. allow signs that are installed as part of the</u>
8	<u>adopt-a-highway program to list, in addition to the sponsor's</u>
9	name, contact information for the sponsor."
10	Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
11	provisions of this act is July 1, 2003.
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
