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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 66-5-205.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989,
17	Chapter 214, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"66-5-205.1. UNINSURED MOTORIST CITATIONREQUIREMENTS TO
19	BE FOLLOWED AT TIME OF ACCIDENTSUBSEQUENT PROCEDURESINSURER
20	NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS SUSPENSION PROCEDURES
21	A. When a law enforcement officer issues a driver
22	who is involved in an accident a citation for failure to comply
23	with the provisions of the Mandatory Financial Responsibility
24	Act, the law enforcement officer shall at the same time:
25	(1) issue to the driver cited a temporary
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operation sticker, valid for thirty days after the date the sticker is issued, and forward by mail or delivery to the department a duplicate of the issued sticker; and

(2) remove the license plate from the vehicle and send it with the duplicate of the sticker to the department or, if it cannot be removed, permanently deface the plate.

B. The department shall return or replace, in its discretion, a license plate removed under the provisions of Paragraph (2) of Subsection A of this section or replace a license plate defaced under that paragraph when the person cited for failure to comply with the provisions of the Mandatory Financial Responsibility Act furnishes proof of compliance to the department and pays to the division a reinstatement fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). If a person to whom the temporary operation sticker is issued furnishes to the department, within fifteen days after the issuance of the sticker, evidence of financial responsibility in compliance with the Mandatory Financial Responsibility Act and in effect on the date and at the time of the issuance of the sticker, the department shall replace or return the license plate and waive the twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) reinstatement fee.

C. The secretary shall adopt and promulgate rules prescribing the form and use of the sticker required to be issued under Subsection A of this section.

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1	D. The secretary shall adopt and promulgate rules
2	requiring insurance carriers to report canceled, terminated and
3	newly issued motor vehicle insurance policies each month to the
4	department; <u>provided, however, that, for a motor vehicle</u>
5	insured under a commercial vehicle policy, the insurer may
6	<u>report either:</u>
7	(1) at the policy level by reporting only:
8	<u>(a) the insurance policy number; or</u>
9	(b) the federal employer identification
10	<u>number; or</u>
11	(2) at the vehicle level by reporting only:
12	<u>(a) the insurance policy number;</u>
13	(b) the vehicle identification number; or
14	(c) the federal employer identification
15	<u>number.</u>
16	E. As used in Subsection D of this section,
17	<u>"commercial vehicle policy" means an insurance policy:</u>
18	(1) covering five or more motor vehicles;
19	(2) insuring a motor vehicle rated or insured as
20	<u>a business or commercial vehicle;</u>
21	(3) insuring a motor vehicle licensed by the
22	<u>state as a commercial vehicle; or</u>
23	(4) covering a motor vehicle issued to a named
24	<u>insured who is not a natural person.</u>
25	F. Information reported pursuant to Subsection D of
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 $[E_{\cdot}]$  G. Within ten days of notification by the 3 insurance carrier of a termination or cancellation of a motor 4 vehicle insurance policy, the department shall demand 5 satisfactory evidence from the owner of the motor vehicle that 6 7 he meets the requirements of the Mandatory Financial 8 Responsibility Act. Failure to provide evidence of financial 9 responsibility within twenty days after the department has 10 mailed its demand for proof:

(1) constitutes reasonable grounds to believe that a person is operating a motor vehicle in violation of the provisions of Section 66-5-205 NMSA 1978; and

(2) requires the department to suspend the
 person's registration as provided in Section 66-5-236 NMSA
 1978.

[F.] <u>H.</u> The department shall notify the superintendent of insurance if an insurance carrier fails to provide monthly reports to the department regarding motor vehicle insurance policy information as required by Subsection D of this section."

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
