AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS; EXEMPTING CERTAIN PROVIDERS FROM VICARIOUS LIABILITY FOR THE ACTIONS OF A PERSONAL CARE ATTENDANT HIRED AND TRAINED BY A CONSUMER OR HIS REPRESENTATI VE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

A new section of the Public Assistance Act is Section 1. enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] FISCAL INTERMEDIARY--EXEMPTIONS--WORKERS' COMPENSATION. - -

A fiscal intermediary shall not be subject to vicarious liability as an employer or principal for a wrongful act committed by a personal care attendant if the attendant:

(1) is not a current or former employee of the fiscal intermediary;

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1	(2) has not received training or instruction
2	from the fiscal intermediary with respect to providing personal
3	care services to a disabled person, not including
4	administrative paper work;
5	(3) has been hired by and received training or
6	instruction from the consumer or his authorized representative
7	to provide personal care to the consumer; and
8	(4) provides basic assistance with daily
9	living activities that do not require the education,
10	certification or training of a licensed health care
11	practitioner.

A fiscal intermediary may identify a personal care attendant as a covered employee with the fiscal intermediary's workers' compensation carrier solely to provide workers' compensation coverage in the event of a work-related Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to i nj ury. create an employer-employee relationship between the fiscal intermediary and the personal care attendant.

- Nothing in this section shall be construed to provide the fiscal intermediary with immunity from a claim for a wrongful act committed by the fiscal intermediary or its employees.
 - D. As used in this section:
- "consumer" means a person who is eligible for and receives state-funded or -operated services based on . 144744. 1

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the person's disabilities;

- (2) "fiscal intermediary" means a provider that furnishes administrative assistance for a consumer who selects a consumer-directed, rather than consumer-delegated, personal care program;
- (3) "personal care attendant" means a person who provides assistance to a consumer with activities of daily living, including bathing, dressing, eating, transportation, shopping and similar activities; and
- (4) "personal care program" means a statefunded or -operated support program, including medicaid, that provides the services of a personal care attendant for certain disabled individuals."

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
