AN ACT
RELATI NG TO MUNI CI PALI TI ES; CLARI FYI NG THAT A MAYOR VOTES TO BREAK TI ES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEG SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. Section 3-12-2 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1965, Chapt er 300, Section 14-11-2, as amended) is amended to read:
" 3-12-2. GOVERNI NG BODY- - CORPORATE AUTHORI TY- - LEGI SLATI VE BODY-- MEMBERS OF COUNCI L AND BOARDS OF TRUSTEES- - QUORUM --
A. The corporate authority of a municipality is vested in the governing body [ hich] that shall constitute the I egi slative branch of the municipality and shall not perform any executive functions except those functions assigned to it by I aw.
B. A maj ority of the members of the governing body is a quorumfor the purpose of transacting busi ness.

C. Unl ess ot herwi se provi ded by Iaw, a question bef ore the governing body shall be deci ded by a maj ority vote of the members present.
D. The governing body of a muni ci pality having a mayor-council formof government is the council or board of trustees whose menbers are the mayor and not less than four or more than ten council men or trustees. Any governing body of more than six councilmen or trustees may provi de by ordi nance for the el ection of two councilmen or trustees for each ward or district or create or abolish wards or districts or alter the boundary of exi sting wards or di stricts; provided that onl y one councilman or trustee shall be el ected froma ward or district at any one el ection.
E. In those muni ci palities [ here a myor has ne vote except in case of a tie vote and $\underline{\text { with }}$ a mayor-council form of government, when there is a requi rement that a certain fraction or percentage of the members of the entire governing body or of all the members of the governing body or of the entire membershi $p$ of the governing body or ot her similar I anguage ot her than the requi rement of a si mple maj ority vote for the measure, the mayor shall not be counted in determing the actual number of votes needed but he shall vote to break a tie vote as provided in Section 3-11-3 NMSA 1978 unl ess he has decl ared a conflict of interest.
F. The governing body of a munici pality may
redistrict the muni ci pality whenever redistricting is warranted. Upon petition signed by qualified el ectors equal in number to the votes cast for the councilman or trustee recei ving the greatest number of votes at the last regul ar muni ci pal el ection, the governing body of the muni ci pality shall redistrict the muni ci pality."
