## SUMMARY

## Synopsis of Bill

1. Section 1. The House Transportation Committee Substitute for House Bill 201 creates a new section of the Motor Vehicle Code, Section 66-3-424 NMSA 1978 which outlines provisions for enacting a description of and requirements for a standardized special registration license plate.
2. Section 2. The bill also provides for a standardized special registration plate with a logo for retired firefighters. The TRD secretary will approve the final logo design for the special registration plate for retired New Mexico firefighters.
3. Section 3. Except for Section 1 of this legislation, the effective date of the provisions of this act is January 1, 2004. The effective date of the provisions of Section 1 of this act is July 1, 2003.

## Significant Issues

During the 2003 session, approximately 20 license plate bills have been introduced, all requesting MVD to produce a specialty plate for their group or organization. While all such requests are worthy of consideration, the Motor Vehicle Division has neither the staff nor the funding to manufacture all of these specialty license plates. Recognizing this problem, the House Transportation Committee inserts a new section of the Motor Vehicle Code:

## 66-3-424. [NEW MATERIAL] STANDARDIZED SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATES WITH LOGOS.--

A. Standardized special registration plates with logos may be authorized by statute to show state support for worthy public purposes. The authorizing statute shall provide for collection of fees that, at a minimum, will cover the costs to the division of development, manufacture and issuance of the special registration plates and logos.
B. Standardized special registration plates, on the standardized areas, shall:
(1) display the colors of the state flag, red lettering on a yellow background;
(2) display the phrases "New Mexico USA" and "Land of Enchantment";
(3) provide a space for applying the special registration logo, centered at the left edge of the plate, between the attachment holes, beginning one-fourth inch in from the edge of the plate and having the following dimension: four and oneeighth inches in height and three and one-eighth inches in width; and
(4) provide a vehicle registration number, to be assigned by the division, that consists of five alphanumeric characters displayed to the right of the special logo area.
C. Special registration logos, except for the standard dimension specified in Paragraph (3) of Subsection B of this section, shall be left to the design discretion of the division, in consultation with the public purpose interest group that requests the special registration plate.
D. Standardized special registration plates with logos, when authorized by statute for a particular public purpose interest group, shall meet the requirements specified in this subsection prior to plate issuance by the division. The public purpose interest group, no later than the effective date of the authorizing statute:
(1) shall provide evidence acceptable to the division that it will generate a minimum number of prepaid applications as determined by the division for the special registration plate with logo;
(2) shall provide a prepayment to the division in an amount sufficient to cover the plate and logo cost of the initial order;
(3) shall provide a sample of the requested artwork design in a format specified
by the plate manufacturer for the specialized logo; and
(4) in cases where the authorizing statute includes revenue-sharing with distribution directed to a particular group or fund, shall show that the recipient is a governmental entity of a fund authorized for the use of a governmental entity.
E. The division may promulgate rules for implementation of the provisions of this section.

## 66-3-424.1. [NEW MATERIAL] STANDARDIZED SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATE FOR RETIRED FIREFIGHERS.--

- Retired New Mexico firefighters must submit proof satisfactory to MVD that they have retired from active employment as a firefighter before purchasing a standardized license plate with a retired firefighter logo.
- Anyone who misrepresents himself as a retired firefighter officer is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be sentenced pursuant to Section 31-19-1 NMSA 1978.

In summary, one standard license plate will be designed pursuant to the provisions highlighted above, and will have a $3 \times 4$ inch rectangular space in the middle onto which a retired firefighter logo or any other specialized logo can be placed. The group wanting the specialty logo must prepay and guarantee a minimum order. The result will be that more specialty logos can be ordered and produced without adversely affecting MVD's budget.

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The fee for the specialty plate logo is $\$ 25$, which will be in addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee. Of that amount, $\$ 10$ will be retained by MVD to defray the cost of producing and issuing special registration plate with logo. The remaining $\$ 25$ shall be deposited to the motor vehicle suspense fund for distribution pursuant to Section 66-6-23 NMSA 1978.

## TECHNICAL

The new section outlining provisions for a standardized special registration plate for retired firefighters, Section 66-3-424.1, has the same numbering sequence as the new section in HTCS602 authorizing issuance of a standardized special plate for retired members of the National Guard (Section 66-3-424.1) and as the new section in HTCS464 for retired New Mexico State Police officers (Section 66-3-424.1).
