Synopsis of Bill

House Joint Memorial 48 requests that the Director of the Explora Science Center and Children's Museum (Explora) and the State Department of Public Education (SDE) develop procedures for informing school districts about the availability of Explora as an educational resource and for assisting school districts with planning overnight visits to Explora, and that the Director of Explora and a representative from the SDE report to the Legislative Education Study Committee (LESC) and the Legislative Finance Committee (LFC) prior to October 31, 2003.

Significant Issues

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

Existing staff from the SDE and Explora will cooperatively develop the procedures to disseminate in formation about Explora and procedures to assist School districts plan overnight visits to the Center.
