#### SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 400 proposes adding one additional day of per diem at the internal revenue service rate for legislators traveling to a location that is one hundred or more miles from the location of the legislator's point of departure when serving on official business for an interim committee.

#### Significant Issues

As of December 20, 2002, Legislative interim committees include the following: Legislative Council; Legislative Finance Committee; Legislative Education Study Committee; Children's Code Revision Committee; Corrections Oversight & Justice Committee; Economic & Rural Development & Telecommunications Committee; Indian Affairs Committee; Information Technology Oversight Committee; Interim Legislative Ethics Committee, Judicial System Study Committee; Legislative Committee on Compacts; Legislative Health & Human Services Committee; Los Alamos National Laboratory Oversight Committee; Medicaid Reform Committee; Mortgage Finance Authority Act Oversight Committee; New Mexico Finance Authority Oversight Committee; Revenue Stabilization & Tax Policy Committee; Tobacco Settlement Revenue Oversight

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This bill does not make an appropriation. However, legislative per diem expenses during the interim would increase depending on location of interim meetings, interim assignments and location of legislator's point of departure.

The current internal revenue service per diem rate is \$145.00 day. If 112 legislators receive 2 additional days of per diem per fiscal year, the cost to implement this bill would be \$32,480. Again, the cost is dependent on location of interim meetings, interim assignments and location of legislator's point of departure so the cost could be less than \$32,480 or could exceed this amount.

### RELATIONSHIP

Senate Bill 400 relates to House Bill 1, the Feed Bill, which contains the FY04 appropriation for legislative expenses.
