AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES; AUTHORIZING NEIGHBORHOOD ELECTRIC CARS, UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS, TO BE DRIVEN ON CERTAIN STREETS, ROADWAYS AND HIGHWAYS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Motor Vehicle Code is enacted to read:

"NEIGHBORHOOD ELECTRIC CARS.--

A. As used in this section, "neighborhood electric car" means a four-wheeled electric motor vehicle that:

(1) has a maximum speed of more than twenty miles per hour but less than twenty-five miles per hour;

(2) complies with the federal requirements specified in 49 CFR 571.500; and

(3) is equipped with head lamps, stop lamps, front and rear turn signal lamps, tail lamps, reflex reflectors, a parking brake, at least one interior and one exterior rear view mirror, a windshield, windshield wipers, a speedometer, an odometer, braking for each wheel, seat belts and a vehicle identification number.

B. Except as provided in Subsection C or D of this section, a neighborhood electric car, properly registered pursuant to the provisions of the Motor Vehicle Code, in compliance with the Mandatory Financial Responsibility Act

1 and driven by an individual with a valid driver's license,
2 may be operated on any street, roadway or highway under the
3 jurisdiction of either the state or a local authority if the
4 posted maximum speed limit is thirty-five miles per hour or
5 less; provided, a neighborhood electric car may cross at an
6 intersection or permitted crossing point at any street,
7 roadway or highway that has a posted maximum speed limit
8 higher than thirty-five miles per hour.

9 C. A local authority may prohibit the operation of
10 neighborhood electric cars on any road under its jurisdiction
11 if the governing body of the local authority determines that
12 the prohibition is necessary in the interest of safety.

13 D. The department of transportation may prohibit
14 the operation of neighborhood electric cars on any road under
15 its jurisdiction if it determines that the prohibition is
16 necessary in the interest of safety.

17 E. Neighborhood electric cars are exempt from the
18 following provisions:

19 (1) the emblems or flashing lights
20 requirement for slow-moving vehicles in Section 66-3-887 NMSA
21 1978;

22 (2) any requirement for vehicle emission
23 inspections adopted by a local authority pursuant to
24 Subsection C of Section 74-2-4 NMSA 1978; and

25 (3) the minimum motor displacement

1 requirement of Paragraph (2) of Subsection A of Section

2 66-7-405 NMSA 1978." _____
