11	REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO
12	PROVIDE FAIR AND EQUITABLE COMPENSATION TO ACEQUIA AND DITCH
13	IRRIGATORS DURING PROLONGED DROUGHT AND WATER SHORTAGES.
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15	WHEREAS, the practice of acequia and ditch irrigation has
16	existed since early Spanish exploration; and
17	WHEREAS, the Rio Grande, Pecos, San Juan, Canadian and Rio
18	Chama are the principal rivers of New Mexico; and
19	WHEREAS, the state engineer and the interstate stream
20	commission have statutory authority over adjudication and
21	augmentation of these and other stream flows; and
22	WHEREAS, New Mexico has experienced prolonged drought,
23	and, as a result, irrigation and conservancy districts have
24	been forced to reduce or eliminate allocations of surface water
25	to farms in order to meet compact delivery requirements to
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Texas and to comply with the federal Endangered Species Act of
 1973; and

WHEREAS, the United States department of agriculture, through its risk management agency, and the farm service agency, pursuant to the federal Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002, have refused to allow enrollment of New Mexico farms as irrigated acreage and to insure them as such; and

WHEREAS, the farm service agency attributes its decision to the management choices of the owner-operators rather than recognizing those conditions caused by drought, compacts or federal laws and court orders; and

WHEREAS, the net effect is inadequate compensation for the increased cost of performing best management practices and the negative impact on base and yield measures in the farm bill and future farm programs; and

WHEREAS, these farm owner-operators continue to pay property taxes at the higher rates of assessed value while revenue from the land has fallen due to drought;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the United States department of agriculture be requested to immediately take action to correct this disparity by:

A. restoring crop insurance eligibility and full coverage as irrigated practice regardless of water use

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B. restoring full enrollment and base-yield
updating as irrigated practice regardless of water
restrictions;

C. creating a task force to develop a national drought standard for irrigated practice and to review and modify existing farm service agency and risk management agency regulations; and

9 D. taking the lead role in advocating passage of10 crop disaster legislation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico congressional delegation be requested to actively promote and support timely action on this matter; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of the United States department of agriculture and to the New Mexico congressional delegation.

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
