AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN RIGHTS; PROVIDING FOR PROTECTION OF GENETIC PRIVACY AGAINST UNLAWFUL DISCRIMINATORY PRACTICES; ENACTING SECTIONS OF THE NMSA 1978.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Human Rights Act, Section 28-1-2.1 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read:

- "28-1-2.1. [NEW MATERIAL] DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Human Rights Act:
- A. "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid, including mitochondrial DNA, complementary DNA and DNA derived from ribonucleic acid; and
- B. "genetic information" means information about the genetic makeup of a person or members of a person's family, including information resulting from genetic analysis, DNA

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composition, participation in genetic research or use of genetic services."

Section 2. A new section of the Human Rights Act, Section 28-1-7.3 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read:

"28-1-7.3. [NEW MATERIAL] UNLAWFUL DISCRIMINATORY PRACTICE. -- It is unlawful discriminatory practice for an employer, labor organization, joint apprentice committee or employment agency to use genetic information in any employmentrelated decisions, including hiring, discharge, promotion, demotion, compensation and terms, conditions and privileges of employment."

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
