11	RELATING TO GAME AND FISH; CREATING A LIABILITY SUSPENSE
12	ACCOUNT; PROVIDING FOR THE REFUND OF HUNTING LICENSE FEES UNDER
13	CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES; PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF HUNTING
14	LICENSES UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. Section 17-1-14 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1921,
18	Chapter 35, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"17-1-14. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES OF STATE GAME
20	COMMISSION GAME PROTECTION FUND <u>LIABILITY SUSPENSE ACCOUNT</u>
21	A. The state game commission shall have general
22	control over the collection and disbursement of all money
23	collected or received under the state laws for the protection
24	and propagation of game and fish, which money shall be paid
25	over to the state treasurer to the credit of the game
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1 protection fund, and the fund, including all earned income 2 [therefrom], shall not be transferred to another fund. Prior 3 to depositing money into the game protection fund, the 4 department of game and fish shall ensure that an amount adequate to cover the cost of refunds allowed by the provisions 5 of Chapter 17 NMSA 1978 is held in a liability suspense 6 7 account. All refunds shall be made from the liability suspense 8 account. Money not needed to cover the cost of refunds shall 9 be deposited in the game protection fund at the end of each 10 month. Chapter 17 NMSA 1978 shall be guaranty to the person 11 who pays for hunting and fishing licenses and permits that the 12 money in that fund shall not be used for any purpose other than 13 as provided in Chapter 17 NMSA 1978.

B. The state game commission shall have authority to:

(1) establish and, through the director of the department of game and fish, to operate fish hatcheries for the purpose of stocking public waters of the state and to furnish fish fry and fingerlings to stock private waters, receipts from such sources to go into the game protection fund;

(2) declare closed seasons in any specifiedlocality and on any species of game or fish threatened withundue depletion from any cause;

(3) establish game refuges for the purpose of providing safe sanctuaries in which game may breed and
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replenish adjacent hunting ranges, it being the purpose of this provision to establish small refuges rather than large preserves or to close large areas to hunting;

(4) purchase lands for game refuges where suitable public lands do not exist, to purchase lands for fish hatcheries and to purchase lands to be maintained perpetually as public hunting grounds, particularly lands suitable for waterfowl hunting, all such lands to be paid for from the game protection fund;

(5) receive by gift or bequest, in the name
and on behalf of the state, lands suitable for game refuges,
hunting grounds, fish hatcheries or for any other purpose
necessary to carry out the provisions of Chapter 17 NMSA 1978;

(6) apply for and accept any state, federal orprivate funds, grants or donations from any source for game andfish programs and projects;

(7) designate certain areas as rest grounds for migratory birds, in which hunting shall be forbidden at all times or at such times as the state game commission shall provide, it being the purpose of this provision not to interfere unduly with the hunting of waterfowl but to provide havens in which they can rest and feed without molestation;

(8) close any public stream or lake or portion thereof to fishing when such action is necessary to protect a recently stocked water, to protect spawning waters or to . 153213.1

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1 prevent undue depletion of the fish;

propagate, capture, purchase, transport or (9) sell any species of game or fish needed for restocking any lands or streams of the state:

after reasonable notice and hearing, (10)suspend or revoke any license or permit issued pursuant to the 6 7 provisions of Chapter 17 NMSA 1978 and withhold license 8 privileges for a definite period not to exceed three years from 9 any person procuring a license through misrepresentation, 10 violating any provisions of Chapter 17 NMSA 1978 or hunting without a proper license;

adopt rules establishing procedures that (11)provide reasonable notice and a hearing before the state game commission for the suspension, revocation or withholding of license privileges of a person charged with violating the provisions of Chapter 17 NMSA 1978, subject to such judicial review as may be provided by law;

(12)conduct studies of programs for the management of endangered and nongame species of wildlife;

establish licenses, permits and (13)certificates not otherwise provided for in Section 17-3-13 NMSA 1978 and charge and collect just and reasonable fees for them; provided the fees shall not exceed the costs of administration associated with the licenses, permits or certificates;

> (14) permit, regulate or prohibit the

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1 commercial taking or capturing of native, free-ranging 2 amphibians or reptiles not specifically protected by law, except for rattlesnake roundups, collection of fish bait and 3 4 lizard races; adopt rules to control, eradicate or 5 (15)6 prevent the spread of a contagious disease, pest or parasite, 7 including chronic wasting disease, to or among game animals. 8 The rules shall include provisions for: 9 (a) notification to the department of 10 game and fish of the diagnosis or suspected presence of a 11 contagious disease; 12 (b) examination by the state 13 veterinarian or [his] the state veterinarian's designee of 14 suspected infected game animals; 15 (c) quarantine, treatment or destruction 16 of an infected game animal; 17 disinfection and isolation of a (d) 18 licensed private park where an infected game animal has been; 19 and 20 indemnification and destruction of a (e) 21 protected game animal; and 22 (16) as necessary, designate areas of the 23 state in which bear-proof garbage containers are required on 24 public and private lands to reduce potential human-bear 25 interactions. . 153213. 1 - 5 -

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C. The director of the department of game and fish shall exercise all the powers and duties conferred upon the state game and fish warden by all previous statutes now in force not in conflict with Chapter 17 NMSA 1978.

D. The state game commission shall have authority to prohibit all hunting in periods of extreme forest fire danger, at such times and places as may be necessary to reduce the danger of destructive forest fires.

E. The hunting, pursuing, capturing, killing or wounding of any game animals, birds or fish in or upon any game refuge, rest ground or closed water or closed area or during any closed season established or proclaimed by the state game commission in accordance with the authority conferred in Chapter 17 NMSA 1978 constitutes a misdemeanor and shall be punishable as prescribed in Chapter 17 NMSA 1978."

Section 2. Section 17-3-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1912, Chapter 85, Section 48, as amended) is amended to read:

"17-3-7. BLANK FORMS--LICENSE ISSUED ONLY ON APPLICATION--FALSE STATEMENT VOIDS LICENSE--RECORDS--REPORTS--ACCOUNTING FOR FEES COLLECTED--<u>REFUND OF FEES--</u> TRANSFER OF HUNTING LICENSE.--

A. The director of the department of game and fish shall prescribe and procure the printing of all forms and blanks that may be required to carry out the intent of Chapter 17 NMSA 1978. All necessary blanks shall be furnished by the . 153213.1 - 6 -

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director to the [several] license collectors. No license shall be issued except as provided in Section 17-3-5 NMSA 1978. Any false statement in any application shall render the license issued void.

B. [Each] <u>A</u> license collector shall keep a correct and complete record of [such license] <u>licenses</u> issued, [by him] which record shall remain in [his] <u>the license collector's</u> office and be open to inspection by the public at all times.

C. [Each] <u>A</u> license collector may collect and retain a vendor fee for each license or permit issued; provided the fee shall be just and reasonable, as determined by regulation of the state game commission, and shall not exceed one dollar (\$1.00) for each license or permit issued; and provided further that no such fee shall be collected by the department of game and fish from the purchaser of a special license. "Special license" includes those licenses for the following species: antelope, elk, Barbary sheep, bighorn sheep, bison, oryx, ibex, gazelle and javelina.

D. [Each] <u>A</u> license collector shall remit to the director of the department of game and fish the statutory fee of all licenses and permits sold [by him] on or before the tenth day of the month following and shall by the same time report the number and kind of licenses issued.

E. <u>Except as provided in Section 17-1-14 NMSA 1978</u>, the director of the department of game and fish shall .153213.1 - 7 -

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1	[forthwith] turn over all money so received to the state
2	treasurer to be credited [by him] to the game protection fund.
3	F. The director of the department of game and fish,
4	<u>in the director's sole discretion, may authorize a refund of</u>
5	the amount of a hunting license fee from the game and fish
6	<u>suspense fund if:</u>
7	(1) upon written application by the licensee,
8	prior to the time of the hunt for which the license has been
9	issued, the director finds that:
10	<u>(a) the licensee has a disability, due</u>
11	<u>to a verified injury or life-threatening illness, that</u>
12	prohibits the licensee from hunting during the period that the
13	<u>license is valid; or</u>
14	(b) the licensee has been deployed by
15	the military and the deployment prevents the licensee from
16	traveling to the hunt during the period that the license is
17	<u>valid; or</u>
18	(2) upon written application by a personal
19	representative of a licensee's estate, the director finds that
20	the licensee died prior to the time of the hunt for which the
21	<u>license was issued.</u>
22	<u>G. The director of the department of game and fish,</u>
23	in the director's sole discretion, may authorize a transfer of
24	<u>a hunting license:</u>
25	(1) to the licensee's designee if, upon
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1	written application by the licensee, prior to the time of the
2	hunt for which the license has been issued, the director finds
3	<u>that:</u>
4	<u>(a) the licensee has a disability, due</u>
5	<u>to a verified injury or life-threatening illness, that</u>
6	prohibits the licensee from hunting during the period that the
7	<u>license is valid; or</u>
8	(b) the licensee has been deployed by
9	the military and the deployment prevents the licensee from
10	traveling to the hunt during the period that the license is
11	<u>valid;</u>
12	(2) to the designee of the licensee's estate
13	if, upon written application by the personal representative of
14	the licensee's estate, the director finds that the licensee
15	<u>died prior to the time of the hunt for which the license was</u>
16	<u>issued; or</u>
17	(3) upon written application by a licensee, to
18	<u>a nonprofit organization approved by the state game commission.</u>
19	<u>H. The state game commission may prescribe, by</u>
20	rule, the documentation necessary for a finding pursuant to
21	Subsection F or G of this section."
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
