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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 3-32-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967,
17	Chapter 84, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"3-32-3. ADDITION TO DEFINITIONSAs used in the
19	Industrial Revenue Bond Act, "project" also means:
20	<u>A.</u> any land and buildings or other improvements
21	thereon and all real and personal property deemed necessary in
22	connection therewith whether or not now in existence which
23	shall be suitable for use by any private institution of higher
24	education or any nonprofit corporation engaged in health care
25	services, including nursing homes, and, for any small
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1 municipality only, office facilities for physicians, any mass 2 transit or other transportation activity involving the movement 3 of passengers, any industrial park, any office headquarters and 4 any research and development facility; or 5 B. urban transit buses, whether or not already in existence, that are: 6 7 (1) manufactured or assembled in New Mexico; 8 (2) equipped to hold at least thirty 9 passengers; and 10 (3) suitable for use by a commercial 11 enterprise for leasing." 12 Section 2. Section 3-32-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1965, 13 Chapter 300, Section 14-31-3, as amended by Laws 2002, Chapter 14 25, Section 3 and by Laws 2002, Chapter 37, Section 3) is 15 amended to read: 16 "3-32-6. ADDITIONAL POWERS CONFERRED ON MUNICIPALITIES .--17 In addition to any other powers [which] that it may now have, 18 [each] a municipality shall have the following powers: 19 Α. to acquire, whether by construction, purchase, 20 gift or lease, one or more projects [which] that shall be 21 located within this state and may be located within or without 22 the municipality or partially within or partially without the 23 municipality, but which shall not be located more than fifteen 24 miles outside of the corporate limits of the municipality; 25 provided that [the]:

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<u>underscored material = new</u> [bracketed material] = delete 1 (1) urban transit buses qualifying as a project pursuant to Subsection B of Section 3-32-3 NMSA 1978 2 need not be continuously located within this state but the 3 4 commercial enterprise using the urban transit buses for leasing 5 shall meet the location requirement of this subsection; and (2) a municipality shall not acquire any 6 7 electricity generation facility project unless the acquisition 8 is approved by the local school board of the school district in 9 which a project is located and the governing body, the local

school board and the person proposing the project negotiate and determine the amount of an annual in-lieu tax payment to be made to the school district by the person proposing the project, for the period that the municipality owns and leases the project, and provided such approval shall not be unreasonably withheld;

B. to sell or lease or otherwise dispose of any or all of its projects upon such terms and conditions as the governing body may deem advisable and as shall not conflict with the provisions of the Industrial Revenue Bond Act;

C. to issue revenue bonds for the purpose of defraying the cost of acquiring by construction and purchase or either any project and to secure the payment of such bonds, all as provided in the Industrial Revenue Bond Act. No municipality shall have the power to operate any project as a business or in any manner except as lessor;

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1 D. to refinance one or more hospital or 501(c)(3) 2 corporation projects and to acquire any such hospital or 3 501(c)(3) corporation project whether by construction, 4 purchase, gift or lease, which hospital or 501(c)(3) 5 corporation project shall be located within this state and may be located within or without the municipality or partially 6 7 within or partially without the municipality, but which shall 8 not be located more than fifteen miles outside of the corporate 9 limits of the municipality, and to issue revenue bonds to 10 refinance and acquire a hospital or 501(c)(3) corporation 11 project and to secure the payment of such bonds, all as 12 provided in the Industrial Revenue Bond Act. [No] A 13 municipality shall <u>not</u> have the power to operate [any] a 14 hospital or 501(c)(3) corporation project as a business or in 15 any manner except as lessor; and

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E. to refinance one or more projects of any private institution of higher education and to acquire any such project, whether by construction, purchase, gift or lease; provided that the project shall be located within this state and may be located within or without the municipality or partially within or partially without the municipality, but the project shall not be located more than fifteen miles outside of the corporate limits of the municipality, and to issue revenue bonds to refinance and acquire any project of any private institution of higher education and to secure the payment of .153372.2
