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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. Section 21-1-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1970,
16	Chapter 9, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"21-1-2. MATRICULATION AND TUITION FEES
18	A. Except as otherwise provided in this section and
19	in [ <del>Section</del> ] <u>Sections</u> 21-1-4.3 <u>and 21-1-4.5</u> NMSA 1978, the
20	boards of regents of the university of New Mexico, New Mexico
21	state university, New Mexico highlands university, western New
22	Mexico university, eastern New Mexico university, New Mexico
23	military institute, New Mexico institute of mining and
24	technology and <u>the governing board of</u> New Mexico junior college
25	shall establish and charge matriculation fees and tuition fees
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as follows:

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2 (1) each student shall be charged a matriculation fee of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) upon 3 4 enrolling in each institution; (2)each student who is a resident of New 5 6 Mexico shall be charged a tuition fee of not less than twenty 7 dollars (\$20.00) a year; 8 each student who is not a resident of New (3) 9 Mexico shall be charged a tuition fee of not less than fifty 10 dollars (\$50.00) a year; 11 (4) each student shall be charged a tuition 12 fee of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) for each summer 13 session: and 14 each student may be charged a tuition fee (5) 15 for extension courses. 16 Except as otherwise provided in this section and **B**. 17 in [Section] Sections 21-1-4.3 and 21-1-4.5 NMSA 1978, the 18 board of regents of northern New Mexico state school shall 19 establish and charge each student a matriculation fee and a 20 tuition fee. 21 C. The board of regents or governing board of each 22 institution may establish and grant gratis scholarships to 23 students who are residents of New Mexico in an amount not to 24 exceed the matriculation fee or tuition and fees, or both. 25 These scholarships are in addition to the lottery tuition . 152245. 2

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scholarships authorized in Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978 and shall be granted to the full extent of available funds before lottery tuition scholarships are granted. The number of scholarships established and granted pursuant to this subsection shall not exceed three percent of the preceding fall semester enrollment in each institution and shall not be established and granted for summer sessions. The president of each institution shall select and recommend to the board of regents or governing board of [his] the institution, as recipients of scholarships, students who possess good moral character and satisfactory initiative, scholastic standing and personality. At least thirty-three and one-third percent of the gratis scholarships established and granted by each board of regents or governing board each year shall be granted on the basis of financial need.

D. The board of regents <u>or governing board</u> of each institution set out in this subsection may establish and grant, in addition to those scholarships provided for in Subsection C of this section, athletic scholarships for tuition and fees. In no event shall the board of regents <u>or governing board</u> of any institution be allowed to award scholarships for tuition and fees for more than the number of athletic scholarships set out in this subsection and in no event shall more than seventy-five percent of the scholarships granted be for out-of-state residents:

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(1) the board of regents of the university of New Mexico may grant up to two hundred ninety-three athletic schol arships;

the board of regents of New Mexico state (2)4 5 university may grant up to two hundred seventy athletic 6 schol arships;

(3) the boards of regents of New Mexico 8 highlands university, eastern New Mexico university and western New Mexico university may each grant up to one hundred forty athletic scholarships; and

(4) the [board of regents] governing board of New Mexico junior college may grant up to fifty-two athletic schol arships.

Е. In the event that the number of athletic scholarships exceeds the number of athletic scholarships permitted that institution by regulations and bylaws of the national collegiate athletic association or the national association of intercollegiate athletics of which that institution is a member, the appropriate board of regents or governing board shall reduce the number of authorized tuition scholarships to comply with association rules and regulations.

Matriculation fees and tuition fees shall be F. fixed and made payable as directed by the board of regents or governing board of each institution, collected by the officers of each institution and accounted for as are other funds of the . 152245. 2

3	Section 2. A new Section 21-1-4.5 NMSA 1978 is enacted to

5	"21-1-4.5. [ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] FEE AND TUITION WAIVER
6	CONDITIONS
7	A. The boards of regents or governing boards of
8	each of the state's public post-secondary educational
9	institutions, including branch, community and junior colleges
10	as well as technical and vocational institutes, shall provide
11	fee and tuition waivers to any person who:
12	(1) meets the institution's academic admission
13	requi rements;
14	(2) applies to and enters college within one
15	year of high school graduation or receipt of a general
16	equi val ency degree;
17	(3) enrolls and remains enrolled as a full-
18	time student;
19	(4) is, or, if the person has reached the age
20	of majority, was, in the custody of the children, youth and
21	families department at the time the person turned eighteen; and
22	(5) maintains a minimum yearly college grade
23	point average of 2.5 in a 4.0 system.
24	B. Tuition and fee waivers provided under this
25	section shall be available for no more than five calendar years
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		1	from the person's first semester of enrollment at an
		2	institution. This waiver shall be available to qualifying
		3	persons at each of the state's institutions of higher education
		4	regardless of the institution in which the student first
		5	enrolled or is applying for transfer."
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
