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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
19	Section 1. Section 21-23-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1971,
20	Chapter 303, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
21	"21-23-3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Post-Secondary
22	Educational Institution Act:
23	A. ["board" or] "commission" means the commission
24	on higher education;
25	B. "career school" means a private post-secondary
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<u>underscored mterial = new</u> [bracketed mterial] = delete educational institution offering a formal educational curriculum in New Mexico for a fee to members of the general public beyond compulsory school age, terminating in a certificate, diploma, associate degree or comparable confirmation of completion of the curriculum;

C. "college" or "university" means a private post-secondary educational institution offering a formal educational curriculum in New Mexico for a fee to members of the general public beyond compulsory school age, terminating in a baccalaureate, master's or doctoral degree or comparable confirmation of completion of the curriculum;

D. "license" means a written [acknowledgement] acknowledgment by the commission that a career school <u>or</u> <u>nonregionally accredited college or university</u> has met the requirements of the commission for offering a formal educational curriculum within New Mexico;

E. "post-secondary educational institution" includes an academic, vocational, technical, business, professional or other school, college or university or other organization or person offering or purporting to offer courses, instruction, training or education <u>from a physical site in New</u> <u>Mexico</u>, through <u>distance education</u>, correspondence or in person [to any person within this state]; and

F. "registration" means a written [acknowledgement] <u>acknowledgment</u> by the commission that a <u>regionally accredited</u> .154489.1 - 2 -

3	Section 2. Section 21-23-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1971,
4	Chapter 303, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:
5	"21-23-4. EXCEPTIONS
6	<u>A.</u> The Post-Secondary Educational Institution Act
7	does not apply to or affect:
8	[A. any] <u>(1) a</u> post-secondary educational
9	institution supported in whole or in part by state or local
10	taxation;
11	[B. any] <u>(2) an</u> occupational, trade or
12	professional school operating pursuant to any New Mexico
13	occupational licensing law;
14	[C. any] <u>(3) a</u> course of instruction provided
15	by an employer to its own employees for training purposes;
16	[D.] <u>(4)</u> institutions <u>that</u> exclusively

Section 21-23-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, 23 Chapter 108, Section 6) is amended to read: 24 "21-23-5. DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION. --25 A. The commission is charged with oversight of all

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 within the state.

B. The commission shall provide for the
registration of all regionally accredited colleges and
universities operating in the state pursuant to the
Post-Secondary Educational Institution Act.

C. The commission shall provide for the licensure of all career schools and all [non-accredited] nonregionally accredited colleges and universities operating in the state pursuant to the Post-Secondary Educational Institution Act."

Section 4. Section 21-23-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, Chapter 108, Section 7) is amended to read:

"21-23-6. REGISTRATION OF COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES--SUBMISSION OF MATERIALS.--

A. Every college or university operating in New Mexico that is <u>regionally</u> accredited or seeking <u>regional</u> accreditation by an accrediting agency approved by the commission shall register with the commission.

B. A college or university registering with the commission pursuant to this section shall provide curriculum and enrollment information, financial information and all publication materials requested by the commission."

Section 5. Section 21-23-6.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, Chapter 108, Section 8) is amended to read:

"21-23-6.1. LICENSURE OF CAREER SCHOOLS--LICENSURE OF . 154489.1

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1 CERTAIN COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES. --

A. [Any] <u>A</u> career school <u>or nonregionally</u>
<u>accredited college or university</u> operating in New Mexico shall
be licensed by the commission. It is unlawful to operate a
career school <u>or nonregionally accredited college or university</u>
without first obtaining a license from the commission.

7 B. [Any] <u>A</u> college or university operating in New 8 Mexico that is not <u>regionally</u> accredited or seeking <u>regional</u> 9 accreditation by an accrediting agency approved by the 10 commission shall be licensed by the commission in the manner 11 provided for career schools or nonregionally accredited 12 colleges or universities. It is unlawful to operate a college 13 or university that is not accredited or seeking accreditation 14 by an accrediting agency approved by the commission without 15 first obtaining a license from the commission.

C. No person other than an employee of an institution licensed pursuant to this section shall, for a salary or fee, solicit attendance at that institution."

Section 6. Section 21-23-6.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, Chapter 108, Section 9) is amended to read:

"21-23-6.2. LI CENSURE STANDARDS--REQUI REMENTS--FEE AUTHORI ZATI ON. --

A. Every career school <u>and nonregionally accredited</u> <u>college and university</u> operating in the state shall annually apply to the commission for licensure. The career school <u>and</u> .154489.1

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<u>nonregionally accredited college or university</u> shall apply on forms approved by the commission, shall supply all information requested by the commission and shall pay an annual licensure fee set by the commission.

B. The commission or its designee shall consider
information submitted by the career school <u>and nonregionally</u>
<u>accredited college or university</u>, information from independent
accreditation bodies and information gathered during visits to
the career school <u>and nonregionally accredited college or</u>
university in determining eligibility for licensure.

C. The commission shall promulgate and file, in accordance with the State Rules Act, rules [and regulations] that:

(1) require each career school <u>and</u> <u>nonregionally accredited college and university</u> to supply annually information regarding enrollment, program completion by students, employment and other educational placements of students and operating revenue budgets;

(2) provide standards and methods for the evaluation and appraisal of career schools <u>and nonregionally</u> <u>accredited colleges and universities;</u>

(3) provide for a tuition refund policy;

(4) require maintenance of adequate records by each career school <u>and nonregionally accredited college and</u> <u>university</u> and provide reasonable availability of records for .154489.1

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1 inspection;

2 (5) regulate the use of deceptive and 3 misleading advertising and determine what information shall be 4 furnished each student prior to enrollment; assure that any career school or 5 (6) 6 nonregionally accredited college or university licensed 7 pursuant to the Post-Secondary Educational Institution Act has 8 entered into a teach-out agreement with at least one other 9 private or public institution operating in the state unless the 10 commission determines that such an agreement is not feasible; 11 (7) provide standards for the award of 12 associate, baccalaureate, master's and doctoral degrees; 13 (8) [encourage] require all [career] degree-14 granting schools to seek appropriate external accreditation by 15 an agency recognized by the federal department of education as 16 a means of assuring quality instruction; 17 name an advisory committee of education (9) 18 providers and consumers, including owners and operators of 19 career schools and nonregionally accredited colleges and 20 uni versi<u>ties;</u> 21 provide for the maintenance of records (10) 22 for career schools and nonregionally accredited colleges and 23 universities no longer in operation; 24 (11) provide standards for the evaluation of 25 the financial stability and ability to meet the commitments of . 154489. 1

The commission may solicit information 10 pertaining to the financial history and stability of a career 11 school or nonregionally accredited college or university and 12 its owners, including information pertaining to actions of 13 bankruptcy filed within the immediately preceding five years. 14 The commission may consider such information in determining eligibility for licensure." 15 16 Section 7. Section 21-23-6.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, 17 Chapter 108, Section 10) is amended to read: 18 "21-23-6.3. FEE AUTHORIZATION. --19 Α. The commission [is authorized to] may establish 20 initial application fees for all colleges, universities or 21 career schools seeking to operate in New Mexico. The initial 22 application fee shall be not less than two hundred dollars 23 (\$200) or more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000). In setting 24 the fee, the commission shall consider the projected revenue of 25 the institution and the projected cost of performing the . 154489. 1 - 9 -

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2	B. The commission [is authorized to] <u>may</u> establish
3	an annual licensing fee for all career schools or <u>nonregionally</u>
4	<u>accredited</u> colleges or universities licensed by the commission.
5	The licensing fee shall be proportionate to each school's gross
6	annual tuition revenue; provided the fee shall be not less than
7	two hundred dollars (\$200) or more than five thousand dollars
8	(\$5, 000).
9	<u>C. The commission may charge a reasonable</u>
10	administrative fee not to exceed the actual cost of providing
11	<u>the administrative service.</u>

13	commission shall be deposited in the post-secondary educational

16	Chapter 303, Section 9, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"21-23-10. <u>DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS</u> CIVIL PENALTIES
18	[No] <u>A. A</u> person [firm or corporation may] <u>shall</u>
19	<u>not</u> :
20	[A.] <u>(1)</u> operate a career school <u>or</u>
21	nonregionally accredited college or university within the state
22	until that [career] school has been licensed by the commission;
23	[B.] <u>(2)</u> operate a <u>regionally accredited</u>
24	college or university within the state until that college or
25	university has registered with the commission;
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1 $[\underline{\mathbf{C}}]$ (3) deny enrollment to or make any 2 distinction or classification of pupils in the program or practices of any post-secondary educational institution under 3 4 the jurisdiction of the commission on account of race, color, culture, ancestry, national origin, sex, age, religion or 5 6 disability; or 7 $[\mathbf{D}$.] (4) solicit, directly or through an agent 8 or employee, the enrollment of any person in a post-secondary 9 educational institution within the state by the use of fraud, 10 misrepresentation or collusion. 11 Whoever violates any provision of this section B. 12 may be assessed a civil penalty not to exceed five hundred 13 dollars (\$500) per day per violation. Civil penalties shall be 14 credited to the current school fund as provided in Article 12, 15 Section 4 of the constitution of New Mexico. 16 C. After an investigation, the commission may take 17 any one or a combination of the following disciplinary actions 18 against a post-secondary education institution licensed in 19 accordance with the Post-Secondary Educational Institution Act: 20 (1) revoke a license; 21 (2) assess a civil penalty as provided in 22 Subsection B of this section; or

(3) impose probation requirements."

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
