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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996,
18	Chapter 71, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"21-1-4.3. TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS AUTHORIZEDCERTAIN
20	EDUCATI ONAL INSTITUTI ONS
21	A. To the extent that funds are made available by
22	the legislature from the lottery tuition fund, the boards of
23	regents of New Mexico state university, New Mexico institute of
24	mining and technology, eastern New Mexico university, western
25	New Mexico university, the university of New Mexico, New Mexico
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highlands university and northern New Mexico state school shall award tuition scholarships for qualified resident students attending their respective institutions and branches of those institutions.

5 **B**. Except as authorized in [Subsection C] <u>Subsections C and D</u> of this section, the tuition scholarships 6 7 authorized in this section shall apply only to full-time 8 resident students who: [immediately upon completion of a high 9 school curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico 10 high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, 11 are accepted for entrance to and attend one of the state 12 educational institutions set forth in this section or one of 13 the branches of those institutions] 14 (1) have completed a high school curriculum at 15 <u>a public New Mexico high school;</u> 16 (2) have completed a high school curriculum at an accredited private New Mexico high school; 17 18 (3) have completed an equivalent high school 19 curriculum at any high school and are the dependents of New 20 Mexico residents who are paying New Mexico income taxes but 21 who, as a result of service in the United States armed forces, 22 are stationed outside of New Mexico at completion; or 23 (4) have received a graduate equivalent 24 diploma; and 25 (5) immediately upon completion of the high . 154472. 1

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<u>school requirements are accepted for entrance to and attend one</u> <u>of the state educational institutions set forth in this section</u> <u>or one of the branches of those institutions.</u>

<u>C.</u> Each tuition scholarship shall be awarded for up to four consecutive years beginning the second semester of the recipient's first year of enrollment, provided that the recipient has maintained residency in New Mexico and maintained a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during his first semester of full-time enrollment.

[C.] D. The tuition scholarships authorized in this section shall also apply to full-time resident students who [immediately upon completion of a high school curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma] meet any of the requirements of Paragraphs (1) through (4) of Subsection B of this section and attend a two-year public post-secondary educational institution in New Mexico and who, upon the completion of that curriculum or at the end of two years, whichever is sooner, transfer to one of the post-secondary state educational institutions set forth in this section. Those students shall be eligible for a tuition scholarship for two consecutive years, provided that those students maintain residency in New Mexico, maintain a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale and attend the institution full time during the regular academic year.

2	section shall also apply to full-time resident students who:
3	(1) meet any of the requirements of Paragraphs
4	(1) through (4) of Subsection B of this section and within one

6	at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school, or of
7	receiving a graduate equivalent diploma] begin service in the
8	United States armed forces; and

12	state educational institutions set forth in this section.
13	[ <del>E.</del> ] <u>F.</u> The commission on higher education shall
14	prepare guidelines setting forth explicit student continuing
15	eligibility criteria and guidelines for administration of the
16	tuition scholarship program. Guidelines shall be distributed
17	to the board of regents of each institution to enable a uniform
18	availability of the resident student tuition scholarships."
19	Section 2. Section 21-13-10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963,
20	Chapter 17, Section 9, as amended) is amended to read:
21	"21-13-10. BOARD DUTIES
22	A. It is the duty of the community college board to
23	determine financial and educational policies of the community
24	college. The community college board shall provide for the
25	management of the community college and execution of these
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policies by selecting a competent president for the community college, and, upon the president's recommendation, the board shall employ other administrative personnel, instructional staff or other personnel as may be needed for the operation, maintenance and administration of the community college.

B. The community college board shall have the power to fix tuition and fee rates for resident and nonresident students of the <u>community college</u> district, to accept gifts, to accept federal aid, to purchase, hold, sell and rent property and equipment and to promote the general welfare of the institution for the best interest of educational service to the people of the community college district.

C. To the extent that funds are made available by the legislature from the lottery tuition fund, the community college board shall award tuition scholarships for qualified resident students attending their respective institutions.

D. The tuition scholarships authorized in this section shall apply only to full-time resident students who: [immediately upon completion of a high school curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, are accepted for entrance to and attend a community college]

(1) have completed a high school curriculum at a public New Mexico high school;

(2) have completed a high school curriculum at . 154472.1

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1	an accredited private New Mexico high school;
2	(3) have completed an equivalent high school
3	curriculum at any high school and are the dependents of New
4	<u>Mexico residents who are paying New Mexico income taxes but</u>
5	who, as a result of service in the United States armed forces,
6	<u>are stationed outside of New Mexico at completion; or</u>
7	(4) have received a graduate equivalent
8	<u>diploma; and</u>
9	(5) immediately upon completion of the high
10	school requirements, are accepted for entrance to and attend

13	<u>E.</u> Each tuition scholarship shall be awarded for up
14	to two consecutive years beginning the second semester of the
15	recipient's first year of enrollment, provided that the
16	recipient has maintained residency in New Mexico and maintained
17	a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during
18	his first semester of full-time enrollment.
19	[ <del>E.</del> ] <u>F.</u> The commission on higher education shall
20	prepare guidelines setting forth explicit student continuing

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school requirements, are accepted for entrance to and attend one of the state educational institutions set forth in this section or one of the branches of those institutions.

<u>C.</u> Each tuition scholarship shall be awarded for up to two consecutive years beginning the second semester of the recipient's first year of enrollment, provided that the recipient has maintained residency in New Mexico and maintained a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during his first semester of full-time enrollment with renewal of an additional two years upon transfer.

[C.-] D. The commission on higher education shall prepare guidelines setting forth explicit student continuing eligibility criteria and guidelines for administration of the tuition scholarship program. Guidelines shall be distributed to the boards of technical and vocational institutes to enable a uniform availability of the resident student tuition scholarships."

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
