20	A. A medicaid recipient eligible for home- and
21	community-based services and hospice services may receive the
22	services concurrently. A medicaid recipient receiving home-

24	the developmentally disabled waiver program, the disabled and
25	elderly waiver program, the HIV/AIDS waiver program, the

medically fragile waiver program and the personal care option program shall not be denied medicaid hospice services on the basis that the recipient receives home- and community-based services.

5 Β. If a medicaid recipient receives home- and community-based services and hospice services concurrently, the 6 7 hospice care program providing hospice services is responsible 8 for assessing, planning, monitoring, directing and evaluating 9 the recipient's care that relates to the recipient's terminal 10 illness and shall maintain communication with the case manager 11 of the home- and community-based services program, or with the 12 case manager's designee, to ensure that the recipient receives 13 appropriate care. The hospice care program and the community-14 based services program shall develop a coordinated plan of care 15 regarding the recipient's terminal illness."

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
