12	OF GAME AND FISH LAWS AND RULES.

14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. Section 17-2-10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1931,
16	Chapter 117, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read:

19	A. [Any] A person violating any of the provisions

punishment is not set forth under this section, shall be fined not less than [fifty dollars (\$50.00)] five hundred dollars (\$500) or more than [five hundred dollars (\$500)] one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or imprisoned not more than six months or both.

Ε. The provisions of this section shall not be interpreted to prevent, constrain or penalize a Native American 8 for engaging in activities for religious purposes, as provided in Section 17-2-14 or 17-2-41 NMSA 1978.

F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to a landowner or lessee, or employee of either of them, who kills an animal on private land, in which they have an ownership or leasehold interest, that is threatening human life or damaging or destroying property, including crops; provided, however, that the killing is reported to the department of game and fish within twenty-four hours and before the removal of the carcass of the animal killed; and provided further that all actions authorized in this subsection are carried out according to [regulations] rules of the department."

EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the Section 2. provisions of this act is July 1, 2005.
