16	Section 1. A new section of The Livestock Code is enacted

19	REGISTRATIONBOARD POWERS AND DUTIESFEES
20	A. As used in this section, "facility" means a
21	horse rescue or retirement facility, including a reserve or
22	preserve, that provides lifelong care or finds new owners for
23	horses that are unwanted or have been neglected or abused or
24	captured wild horses that cannot be returned to their range.
25	B. A facility shall not operate in New Mexico
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1 unless registered by the board. 2 The board shall: C. 3 (1) register facilities that meet the 4 requirements of this section; 5 (2) annually consult with representatives from 6 the equine industry, equine rescue organizations and 7 veterinarians on facility standards; and 8 (3) after consideration of recommendations by 9 national organizations for the care of unwanted horses and 10 equine rescue and retirement facilities, promulgate rules for 11 facilities, including: 12 health and sanitary requirements; (a) 13 standards for barns, paddocks, (b) 14 pastures and ranges; 15 (c) qualifications of the facility 16 staff; 17 provision of veterinary care; (d) 18 (e) feeding and watering requirements; 19 transportation; and (f) 20 other requirements necessary to (g) 21 ensure the humane care of horses. 22 D. The board may charge the following fees: 23 an initial inspection and registration fee (1)24 of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500); 25 (2) an annual inspection and registration fee .156787.2 - 2 -

4	E. Fees collected pursuant to this section shall be

8	Section 2. A new section of The Livestock Code is enacted

11	INSPECTIONSREINSPECTION
12	A. Prior to annual registration, each facility
13	shall be inspected in accordance with board rules.
14	B. The board or its agents may enter the premises
15	of a facility to conduct unannounced inspections.
16	C. If, following an inspection, the board
17	determines that the facility does not meet the board's minimum
18	facility requirements, it shall give the registrant written
19	notice of the deficiencies and schedule a reinspection,
20	allowing a reasonable time for the registrant to correct the
21	deficiencies.
22	D. The registrant shall remedy the deficiencies and
23	submit evidence to the board demonstrating compliance with
24	board rules for the facility.
25	E. If on reinspection the board determines that the
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facility is still deficient in those areas for which it has been given written notice, the horses may be impounded in accordance with the provisions of Section 77-18-2 NMSA 1978 and the board shall hold a hearing as provided in the Uniform Licensing Act to determine if the registration should be suspended or revoked. If a facility's registration is suspended or F. revoked, the board shall place the horses in another facility." - 4 -.156787.2

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
