15	Section 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGSThe legislature finds
16	that Native Americans resided on lands now known as the state
17	of New Mexico for many centuries and developed traditional home
18	sites and pathways that long predated ownership rights later
19	asserted by the United States of America. Furthermore, the
20	legislature finds that at the time lands were conveyed to the
21	state of New Mexico by the act of congress of June 20, 1910,
22	entitled "An act to enable the people of New Mexico to form a
23	constitution and state government and be admitted into the
24	union on an equal footing with the original states", there were
25	no surveys of traditional occupancy or use of those lands by

PUBLIC LANDS--IMPLIED EASEMENTS.--The current Section 2. use of home sites and roads used since January 6, 1912 by New Mexico residents on lands conveyed to the state of New Mexico by the act of congress of June 20, 1910, entitled "An act to enable the people of New Mexico to form a constitution and state government and be admitted into the union on an equal footing with the original states", and still owned by the state are permitted by implied easement and include the right to improve roads and provide utilities.
