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state board and filing with the state records center and publication. A copy shall also be filed with the department of finance and administration.]

4 All public schools and school districts shall Β. 5 comply with [the rules and procedures prescribed and shall, upon request] department requests to submit additional reports 6 7 concerning finances to the department. In addition, upon 8 request, all public schools and school districts shall file 9 reports with the department containing pertinent details 10 regarding applications for federal money or federal grants-in-11 aid or regarding federal money or federal grants-in-aid 12 received, including details of programs, matching funds, 13 personnel requirements, salary provisions and program numbers, 14 as indicated in the catalog of federal domestic assistance, of 15 the federal funds applied for and of those received.

C. Whoever signs a school district or charter school budget report for submission to the department shall certify in writing that the report contains correct classification of expenditures and true reporting of public school funds under the school district's or charter school's control. An intentional misclassification of expenditures or untrue reporting of public school funds shall constitute just grounds for suspending or revoking any license issued to that person by the department. The department may take whatever other action is provided for by law and rule against any person who makes or assists in making .156063.1
