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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 22-8-25 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1981,
17	Chapter 176, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"22-8-25. STATE EQUALIZATION GUARANTEE DISTRIBUTION
19	DEFINITIONSDETERMINATION OF AMOUNT
20	A. The state equalization guarantee distribution is
21	that amount of money distributed to each school district to
22	ensure that the school district's operating revenue, including
23	its local and federal revenues as defined in this section, is
24	at least equal to the school district's program cost.
25	B. "Local revenue", as used in this section, means
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seventy-five percent of receipts to the school district derived from that amount produced by a school district property tax applied at the rate of fifty cents (\$.50) to each one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of net taxable value of property allocated to the school district and to the assessed value of products severed and sold in the school district as determined under the Oil and Gas Ad Valorem Production Tax Act and upon the assessed value of equipment in the school district as determined under the Oil and Gas Production Equipment Ad Valorem Tax Act. The school district shall budget and expend twenty percent of the total revenue receipts for capital outlay.

C. "Federal revenue", as used in this section, means receipts to the school district, excluding amounts that, if taken into account in the computation of the state equalization guarantee distribution, result, under federal law or regulations, in a reduction in or elimination of federal school funding otherwise receivable by the school district, derived from the following:

(1) seventy-five percent of the school district's share of forest reserve funds distributed in accordance with Section 22-8-33 NMSA 1978. The school district shall budget and expend twenty percent of the total forest reserve receipts for capital outlay; and

(2) seventy-five percent of grants from the federal government as assistance to those areas affected by
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1 federal activity authorized in accordance with Title 20 of the 2 United States Code, commonly known as "PL 874 funds" or "impact 3 aid". The school district shall budget and expend twenty 4 percent of the grant receipts for capital outlay.

5 D. To determine the amount of the state
6 equalization guarantee distribution, the [state superintendent]
7 department shall:

8 (1) calculate the number of program units to
9 which each school district is entitled using an average of the
10 MEM on the [fortieth] eightieth and one hundred twentieth days
11 of the prior year; or

(2) calculate the number of program units to which a school district operating under an approved year-round school calendar is entitled using an average of the MEM on appropriate dates established by the [state board] department; or

(3) calculate the number of program units to which a school district with a MEM of two hundred or less is entitled by using an average of the MEM on the [fortieth] eightieth and one hundred twentieth days of the prior year or the fortieth day of the current year, whichever is greater; [and] or

(4) for those charter schools or school
districts that are implementing a formula-based program for the
first time, calculate the number of program units using
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1	current-year fortieth day memberships; and
2	[(4)] (5) using the results of the
3	calculations in Paragraph (1), (2), [or] (3) <u>or (4)</u> of this
4	subsection and the instructional staff training and experience
5	index from the October report of the prior school year,
6	establish a total program cost of the school district;
7	[(5)] <u>(6)</u> calculate the local and federal
8	revenues as defined in this section;
9	[(6)] (7) deduct the sum of the calculations
10	made in Paragraph [(5)] <u>(6)</u> of this subsection from the program
11	cost established in Paragraph [(4)] (5) of this subsection; and
12	[(7)] <u>(8)</u> deduct the total amount of
13	guaranteed energy savings contract payments that the [state
14	superintendent] department determines will be made to the
15	school district from the public school utility conservation
16	fund during the fiscal year for which the state equalization
17	guarantee distribution is being computed.
18	E. The amount of the state equalization guarantee
19	distribution to which a school district is entitled is the
20	balance remaining after the deductions made in Paragraphs [(6)]
21	(7) and [(7)] <u>(8)</u> of Subsection D of this section.
22	F. The state equalization guarantee distribution
23	shall be distributed prior to June 30 of each fiscal year. The
24	calculation shall be based on the local and federal revenues
25	specified in this section received from June 1 of the previous
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	1	fiscal year through May 31 of the fiscal year for which the
	2	state equalization guarantee distribution is being computed.
	3	In the event that a school district has received more state
	4	equalization guarantee funds than its entitlement, a refund
	5	shall be made by the school district to the state general
	6	fund."
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
