## AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMALS: PROHIBITING THE SLAUGHTER OF HORSES IN NEW MEXICO: PROHIBITING THE POSSESSION OR IMPORTATION OF HORSE MEAT FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION; PROVIDING FOR LICENSE REVOCATION; PRESCRIBING CRIMINAL PENALTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of The Livestock Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] SLAUGHTER OF HORSES OR POSSESSION OR IMPORTATION OF HORSE MEAT FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION UNLAWFUL--PENALTI ES- - EXCEPTI ON. - -

- It is unlawful for any person in New Mexico to slaughter a horse.
- It is unlawful for any person in New Mexico to possess or import horse meat if that person knows or should . 152052. 2

know that any of the meat is intended for human consumption.

- C. Any person who violates the provisions of Subsection A or B of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by imprisonment for a definite term of less than one year or the payment of a fine of not less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) or more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) or both such imprisonment and fine.
- D. In addition to the criminal penalty provided for in Subsection C of this section, any person who is licensed by the board as a butcher, slaughterer or slaughtering establishment; cold storage plant operator; or seller, dealer, peddler, manufacturer or processor of fresh meat or meat products who is found guilty of violating the provisions of Subsection A or B of this section shall have his license revoked.
- E. Nothing in this section prohibits a horse from being euthanasized and then rendered for dog food or other products that are not intended for human consumption."
- Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2005.
