BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Public Health Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] BODY ART--PROHIBITION.--

- A. It is unlawful for a person to administer or offer to administer body art upon a minor.
 - B. As used in this section:
- (1) "body art" means tattooing, the practice of depositing pigment that is either permanent, semipermanent or temporary into the epidermis using needles and includes permanent cosmetics, dermography, micropigmentation, permanent color technology and micropigment implantation, by someone

other than a state-licensed physician or a person under the
supervision of a state-licensed physician; and scarification,
the practice of cutting into the skin with a sharp instrument
