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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
19	Section 1. Section 72-4A-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2001,
20	Chapter 164, Section 4) is amended to read:
21	"72-4A-4. WATER TRUST BOARD CREATED
22	A. The "water trust board" is created. The board
23	is composed of the following fifteen members:
24	(1) the state engineer or $[his]$ the state
25	<u>engineer's</u> designee, who shall be the chairman of the board;
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1	(2) the executive director of the New Mexico
2	finance authority or the executive director's designee;
3	(3) the secretary of environment or $[his]$ the
4	<u>secretary's</u> designee;
5	(4) the secretary of energy, minerals and
6	natural resources or [his] <u>the secretary's</u> designee;
7	(5) the director of the department of game and
8	fish or [his] <u>the director's</u> designee;
9	(6) the director of the New Mexico department
10	of agriculture or [his] <u>the director's</u> designee;
11	(7) the executive director of the New Mexico
12	municipal league or [his] <u>the executive director's</u> designee;
13	(8) the executive director of the New Mexico
14	association of counties or [his] <u>the executive director's</u>
15	desi gnee;
16	(9) five public members appointed by the
17	governor and confirmed by the senate and who represent:
18	(a) the environmental community;
19	(b) an irrigation or conservancy
20	district that uses surface water;
21	(c) an irrigation or conservancy
22	district that uses ground water;
23	(d) acequia water users; and
24	(e) soil and water conservation
25	districts;
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(10) one public member appointed by the
[commission on] secretary of Indian affairs; and

(11) the president of the Navajo Nation or
 [his] the president's designee.

B. The board shall meet at the call of the chairman or whenever three members submit a request in writing to the chairman, but not less often than once each calendar year. A majority of members constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. The affirmative vote of at least a majority of a quorum present shall be necessary for an action to be taken by the board.

C. Each public member of the board appointed by the governor shall be appointed to a four-year term. To provide for staggered terms, two of the initially governor-appointed public members shall be appointed for terms of two years and three members for terms of four years. Thereafter, all governor-appointed members shall be appointed for four-year terms. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the governor for the remainder of the unexpired term.

D. Public members of the board shall be reimbursed for attending meetings of the board as provided for nonsalaried public officers in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance.

E. Public members of the board are appointed public officials of the state while carrying out their duties and .152829.2 - 3 -

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activities under the Water Project Finance Act."

Section 2. Section 72-4A-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2001, Chapter 164, Section 5, as amended by Laws 2003, Chapter 139, Section 3 and by Laws 2003, Chapter 365, Section 1) is amended to read:

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"72-4A-5. BOARD--DUTLES.--The board shall:

7 adopt rules governing terms and conditions of A. 8 grants or loans recommended by the board for appropriation by 9 the legislature from the water project fund, giving priority to 10 projects [that have urgent needs, that have been identified for 11 implementation of] that have been identified as being urgent to 12 meet the needs of a regional water planning area in accordance 13 with part of a regional water plan under development or in 14 <u>accordance with</u> a completed regional water plan [that is] 15 accepted by the interstate stream commission, [and] that have 16 matching contributions from federal or local funding sources 17 available and that have obtained all requisite state and 18 federal permits and authorizations necessary to initiate the 19 project; and

B. authorize qualifying water projects to the authority that are for:

(1) storage, conveyance or delivery of waterto end users;

(2) implementation of federal EndangeredSpecies Act of 1973 collaborative programs;

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1	(3) restoration and management of watersheds;
2	(4) flood prevention; or
3	(5) [water] conservation, <u>recycling, treatment</u>
4	or reuse of water as provided by law [and
5	C. create a drought strike team to coordinate
6	responses to emergency water shortages caused by drought
7	conditions]."
8	Section 3. Section 72-4A-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2001,
9	Chapter 164, Section 9) is amended to read:
10	"72-4A-9. WATER PROJECT FUNDCREATEDPURPOSE
11	A. The "water project fund" is created in the New
12	Mexico finance authority and shall consist of distributions
13	made to the fund from the water trust fund and payments of
14	principal of and interest on loans for approved water projects.
15	The fund shall also consist of any other money appropriated,
16	donated, distributed or otherwise allocated to the fund for the
17	purpose of supporting water projects pursuant to provisions of
18	the Water Project Finance Act. The fund shall be administered
19	by the authority. Income from investment of the water project
20	fund shall be credited to the fund. Balances in the fund at
21	the end of any fiscal year shall not revert to the general
22	fund. The water project fund may consist of such subaccounts
23	as the authority deems necessary to carry out the purposes of
24	the fund. The authority may establish procedures and adopt
25	rules as required to administer the fund and to recover from
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the fund costs of administering the fund and originating grants
 and loans.

B. Money in the water project fund may be used to make loans or grants to qualified entities for any project approved by the legislature.

C. The authority is authorized to issue revenue bonds payable from the proceeds of loan repayments made into the water project fund upon a determination by the authority that issuance of the bonds is necessary to replenish the principal balance of the fund. The net proceeds from the sale of the bonds shall be deposited in the water project fund. The bonds shall be authorized and issued by the authority in accordance with the provisions of the New Mexico Finance Authority Act."

Section 4. REPEAL.--Laws 2003, Chapter 139, Section 3 is repealed.

Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2005.

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
