To implement the state policy, the state game 3 commission shall develop and administer a "gaining access into 4 nature program" pursuant to the provisions of this section. 5 С. In addition to its other powers, in order to 6 develop and administer the gaining access into nature program, 7 the state game commission may: 8 designate areas and properties under its (1) 9 control where activities other than hunting, fishing and 10 trapping are available to the public; 11 (2)designate activities that may take place 12 on properties under its control and designate conditions and 13 qualifications for the activities; 14 enter into partnership and joint powers (3) 15 agreements, leases and other contractual arrangements with 16 other state agencies, private landowners and other private 17 entities to jointly administer, promote and expand the gaining 18 access into nature program; 19 (4) issue permits, special use licenses and 20 other authorizations for access to individuals and 21 organizations to access state game commission properties for 22 purposes of participating in gaining access into nature 23 programs and charge fees for the access privileges; provided 24 that the fees do not exceed the reasonable costs associated 25 with developing and administering the gaining access into . 153671. 2GR
