13	A. The commission shall establish and maintain a
14	process to monitor and improve articulation through frequent
15	and systematic consultation with institutions. Institutions
16	shall monitor the progress of each transfer student and provide
17	appropriate information to the student's originating
18	institution.
19	B. The commission shall establish a complaint
20	procedure for transfer students who fail to receive credit for
21	courses contained in a transfer module taken at another
22	institution. The commission may set standards for determining
23	bona fide complaints, including a requirement that students
24	follow institutions' internal procedures for resolving
25	complaints prior to submitting them to the commission. The
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commission shall investigate all articulation complaints and render decisions as to the appropriateness of the actions of the participants.

C. Prior to December 31 of each year, the commission shall summarize all articulation complaints filed with the commission and the decisions of the commission with regard to those complaints. For those complaints for which the commission finds merit, the commission shall calculate the number of credits refused at the receiving institution and recommend a corresponding reduction of legislative funding to the next session of the legislature.

D. If a student's articulation complaint is upheld, the receiving institution shall reimburse the student the complete cost, including tuition, books and fees, of each course the student was required to repeat at the receiving institution."

Section 6. A new section of the Post-Secondary Education Articulation Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] ARTICULATION COMPLAINT PROCESS--NOTIFICATION.--The receiving institution shall publish in the student handbook or otherwise notify transfer students of the complaint process to be followed in the event that a transfer module course is not accepted for credit. The notification shall include the remedy available to the student if the complaint is upheld."

4	A. Prior to December 31 of each year, the
5	commission shall report to the legislative finance committee,

7	regarding the status of articulation programs and the transfer
8	of students between institutions.
9	B. The report developed by the commission shall
10	include an analysis of the number of students transferring
11	between campuses, the number of credits being requested and
12	accepted for transfer, institutions denying transfer of credits
13	and reasons for denial, the progress of transfer students at
14	receiving institutions, <u>the average number of credit hours</u>
15	taken by graduating transfer students compared to the average
16	number of credit hours taken by graduates who originated at the
17	institution and a summary of student complaints regarding
18	articulation. The report shall include data and other
19	information obtained on both a statewide and individual
20	institution basis.

22	such factors as transfer rates, persistence rates after
23	transfer and graduation rates.

7	module for business and early childhood education and the

9	those modules shall be effective by spring semester 2006, and
10	the printed materials of all institutions shall conform to the
11	system by fall 2006. A minimum of three additional discipline
12	modules shall be effective not later than fall semester 2007
13	and an additional three discipline modules by fall semester
14	<u>2008.</u> "
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
