A new section of the Procurement Code is Section 2. enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] DEFINITION -- INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY. --4 "Information technology" means computer and voice and data 6 communication software and hardware, including imaging systems, 7 terminals and communications networks and facilities, staff 8 information systems services and professional services 9 contracts for information systems services."

10 A new section of the Procurement Code is Section 3. 11 enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] DEFINITION--INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PROJECT. -- "Information technology project" means the development, purchase, replacement or modification of a software system, including all phases or modules of a project with a common objective."

Section 4. A new section of the Procurement Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] DEFINITION--SOFTWARE SYSTEM -- "Software system" means written programs, procedures or rules and associated documentation pertaining to the operation of a computer system that are stored in some form of electronic media."

A new section of the Procurement Code is Section 5. enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] CONTRACTS - - ATTORNEY GENERAL REVIEW. - -

A. Contracts that are not exempt from the provisions of the Procurement Code and that have a total cost in excess of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) shall be reviewed and approved by the office of the attorney general before final approval can be given by the contracting state agency.

B. The provisions of this section do not apply to contracts for emergency procurements pursuant to the provisions of Section 13-1-127 NMSA 1978."

Section 6. A new section of the Procurement Code is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PROJECT CONTRACTS--REVIEW--WARRANTIES--HOLDBACK FUNDS.--Contracts for an information technology project with a total cost in excess of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) shall comply with the following requirements in addition to requirements imposed by the Procurement Code or other applicable state statute or rule:

A. the contract shall be reviewed and approved by the state agency contracting for the project, the department of finance and administration, the office of the attorney general and the office of the chief information officer;

B. the contract shall provide for a holdback from payment to the contractor of funds comprising at least ten percent of the total contract price, which holdback funds shall . 152594.2

8 Section 8. A new section of the Procurement Code is9 enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PROJECT CONTRACTS--RELEASE OF HOLDBACK FUNDS. --Holdback funds shall be released only when the state agency contracting for the project and the office of the chief information officer have determined that all of the terms of the contract for the information technology project have been satisfied by the contractor and that the software system is performing in accordance with the specifications contained in the contract."
