AN ACT
RELATI NG TO SCHOOLS; ESTABLI SH NG NUTRI TI ONAL STANDARDS AND STANDARD PORTI ONS; ENACTI NG THE COMPETI TI VE FOODS I N SCHOOLS ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEG SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:
"[ NEW MATERI AL] SHORT TI TLE. -- Thi s act may be cited as the "Competitive Foods in Schools Act"."

Section 2. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:
"[ NEW MATERI AL] DEFI NI TI ONS. - - As used in the Compet itive Foods in School s Act:
A. "competitive beverage" means a bever age offered or sold at school other than a bever age served through the . 153576. 3

United States department of agriculture's school breakfast, national school I unch and after-school snack prograns; and
B. "competitive food" means a food offered or sol d at school ot her than a food served through the United States department of agriculture's school breakfast, national school I unch and after-school snack prograns."

Section 3. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:
"[ NEW MATERI AL] DEPARTMENT DUTIES. -- The department shal I approve a list of competitive foods and competitive beverages approved for offer or sale at public schools and charter schools based on compl iance with the provisions of the Competitive Foods in Schools Act and make the list available to school districts."

Section 4. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:
"[ NEW MATERI AL] VENDOR CONTRACTS FOR FOOD SERVI CE I N SCHOOLS.--Contracts for food and bever age vending shall not bind school di stricts or school food services to exclusive or multi year provisions."

Section 5. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:
" [ NEW MATERI AL] REWARDS. - - Foods and bever ages, i ncl uding coupons to be redeemed outside the school setting, shall not be used as rewards for indi vi dual students or groups of students, . 153576. 3
or be withhel d as puni shment."
Section 6. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:
" [ NEW MATERI AL] COMMERCI AL ADVERTI SI NG. - - Al I vendi ng machi nes located on school property shall exclude graphi cs that do not promote one hundred percent fruit and veget able juices, water, milk, physical activity and health."

Section 7. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:
"[ NEW MATERI AL] EXAMPLES SET BY SCHOOL PERSONNEL. - - School personnel shall eat foods and drink beverages that comply with the Competitive Foods in School s Act when eating with thei $r$ students at school."

Section 8. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:
" [ NEW MATERI AL] ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS. - From one hour bef ore through one-half hour after the school day, no competitive food or competitive beverage shall be offered or sold on an el ementary school campus. Itens used in nutrition education I essons or served at cel ebrations are exempt fromthe provi si ons of thi section."

Section 9. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:
" [ NEW MATERI AL] SECONDARY SCHOOLS. - -
A. From one hour bef ore through one-hal f hour after . 153576. 3
the school day, all competitive foods and competitive beverages offered or sold on a middle, juni or high or high school campus shall comply with the provisions of this section. Items used in nutrition education lessons or served at cel ebrations are exempt from the provisions of this section.
B. The following competitive beverages shall be al I owed:
(1) dri nki ng water;
(2) one hundred percent pl ai n and flavored milk that does not exceed two percent fat content;
(3) soymilk that contai ns no less than six grans of protein and no less than two hundred ei ghty-five milligrans of cal ci umper ei ght fluid ounces;
(4) yogurt beverages;
(5) one hundred percent fruit and veget able j ui ces;
(6) fruit-based drinks that contain at least fifty percent fruit juice and have no added sugars; and
(7) el ectrol yte repl acement bever ages that contain no more than twent $y$-three grans of sugars per twel ve fl uid ounces.
C. Qual ifying competitive foods shall provide:
(1) not more than thirty percent of total cal ories fromfat, excluding nuts, seeds and cheeses;
(2) not more than ten percent of total
cal ories fromsaturated fat and trans fat conbi ned; and
(3) not more than thirty-five percent of total wei ght fromsugar, excl uding dried fruits.
D. Itens of fered or sold in single-serving packages, except for fresh fruits and vegetables, milk and water, shall be limited to these portion sizes:
(1) t wel ve fluid ounces for bever ages;
(2) ei ght ounces for yogurts that are not in frozen or beverage form
(3) one and one-fourth ounces for snacks, i ncl udi ng chi ps, crackers, popcorn, cereal, trail mix, nuts, seeds, cheeses, dried fruit and jerky;
(4) two ounces for cooki es and cereal bars;
(5) three ounces for bakery itens; and
(6) three ounces for frozen desserts.
E. Itens not of fered or sold in single-serving packages shall not exceed the portion-sizelimits set by the United States department of agriculture school meals prograns."

Section 10. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:
" [ NEW MATERI AL] RULEMAKI NG. - - The department in consultation with the department of health shall adopt and promil gate rul es by August 1, 2005 in compl iance with the Competitive Foods in Schools Act, and such rul es shall require compl iance of all school di stricts and charter schools. The . 153576. 3
rul es shall:
A. require a preference for New Mexi co-grown foods for purchase in the United States department of agriculture's meals programs and for competitive food and competitive bever age sal es;
B. requi re preference for min mally processed, nat urally nutrient-dense-per-cal orie foods and beverages;
C. requi re preference for school fundrai sing activities that use nonfood items; and when foods and beverages are used for fundraising activities, require the use of foods and bever ages that meet the provisions of the Competitive Foods in School s Act;
D. requi re each school di strict to invol ve students in creating school well ness pol icies; and
E. Iimit school cel ebrations that invol ve the use of foods and beverages to special and infrequent occasions and restrict foods and beverages at cel ebrations to those that comply with the standards of the Competitive Foods in Schools Act."
