15	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
16	"Hi spani c Affairs Act".
17	Section 2. OFFICE CREATEDPOWERS AND DUTIES
18	A. The "office of Hispanic affairs" is created and
19	is administratively attached to the human services department.
20	B. The governor shall appoint a director, who shall
21	work at the pleasure of the governor. The director shall
22	employ other necessary employees, who shall be subject to the
23	provisions of the Personnel Act.

21	Section 3. FUND CREATEDADMINISTRATIONThe "office of
22	Hispanic affairs fund" is created in the state treasury. The
23	fund shall consist of appropriations, gifts, grants, donations
24	and bequests. Money in the fund at the end of any fiscal year

shall revert to the general fund. The fund shall be

administered by the office of Hispanic affairs, and disbursements from the fund shall be made on warrants drawn by the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the director of the office or the director's authorized representative.

Section 4. APPROPRIATION.--Two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the office of Hispanic affairs fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2006 and subsequent fiscal years to pay the costs of establishing the office, hiring staff and carrying out the provisions of the Hispanic Affairs Act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall revert to the general fund.

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
