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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. Section 22-1-1.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
16	Chapter 153, Section 2) is amended to read:
17	"22-1-1.2. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND PURPOSE
18	A. The legislature finds that no education system
19	can be sufficient for the education of all children unless it
20	is founded on the sound principle that every child can learn
21	and succeed, and the system must meet the needs of all children
22	by recognizing that student success for every child is the
23	fundamental goal.
24	B. The legislature finds further that the key to
25	student success in New Mexico is to have a multicultural
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1 education system that: 2 (1)attracts and retains quality and diverse teachers to teach New Mexico's multicultural student 3 4 popul ati on; holds teachers, students, schools, school (2)5 districts and the state accountable: 6 7 integrates the cultural strengths of its (3) 8 diverse student population into the curriculum with high 9 expectations for all students; 10 recognizes that cultural diversity in the (4) 11 state presents special challenges for policymakers, 12 administrators, teachers and students; and 13 elevates the importance of public (5) 14 education in the state by clarifying the governance structure 15 at different levels. 16 The legislature finds further that the teacher С. 17 shortage in this country has affected the ability of New Mexico 18 to compete for the best teachers, and that unless the state and 19 school districts find ways to mentor beginning teachers, 20 intervene with teachers while they still show promise, improve 21 the job satisfaction of quality teachers and elevate the 22 teaching profession by shifting to a professional educator 23 licensing and salary system, public schools will be unable to 24 recruit and retain the highest quality teachers in the teaching 25 profession in New Mexico.

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1 D. The legislature finds further that a well-2 designed, well-implemented and well-maintained assessment and 3 accountability system is the linchpin of public school reform 4 and must ensure that: students who do not meet or exceed 5 (1)6 expectations will be given individual attention and assistance 7 through extended learning programs and individualized tutoring; 8 teachers who do not meet performance (2) 9 standards must improve their skills or they will not continue 10 to be employed as teachers; 11 (3) public schools make adequate yearly 12 progress toward educational excellence; and 13 school districts and the state are (4) 14 prepared to actively intervene and improve failing public 15 schools. 16 Ε. The legislature finds further that improving 17 children's reading and writing abilities and literacy must 18 remain a priority of the state. 19 F. The legislature finds further that the public 20 school governance structure needs to change to provide 21 accountability from the bottom up instead of from the top down. 22 Each school principal, with the help of school councils made up 23 of parents and teachers, must be the instructional leader in 24 the public school, motivating and holding accountable both 25 teachers and students. 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1 as the school district's chief executive officer and have 2 responsibility for the day-to-day operations of the school district, including personnel, except for certified personnel 3 whose hiring and firing shall be approved or disapproved by the 4 5 <u>local school board</u>, and student disciplinary decisions. It is the purpose of this [2003] public school 6 G. 7 reform legislation to provide the framework to implement the legislative findings to ensure student success in New Mexico." 8 9 Section 2. 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H. provide for the repair of and maintain all
property belonging to the school district;

I. for good cause and upon order of the district court, subpoena witnesses and documents in connection with a hearing concerning any powers or duties of the local school board;

J. except for expenditures for salaries, contract for the expenditure of money according to the provisions of the Procurement Code;

K. adopt rules pertaining to the administration of all powers or duties of the local school board;

L. accept or reject any charitable gift, grant, devise or bequest. The particular gift, grant, devise or bequest accepted shall be considered an asset of the school district or the public school to which it is given;

M offer and, upon compliance with the conditions of such offer, pay rewards for information leading to the arrest and conviction or other appropriate disciplinary disposition by the courts or juvenile authorities of offenders in case of theft, defacement or destruction of school district property. All such rewards shall be paid from school district funds in accordance with rules promulgated by the department; and

N. give prior approval for any educational program in a public school in the school district that is to be .154007.1 - 5 -

3	Section 3. Section 22-5-14 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
4	Chapter 153, Section 25) is amended to read:
5	"22-5-14. LOCAL SUPERINTENDENTPOWERS AND DUTIES
6	A. The local superintendent is the chief executive
7	officer of the school district.
8	B. The local superintendent shall:
9	(1) carry out the educational policies and
10	rules of the state board and local school board;
11	(2) administer and supervise the school
12	district;
13	(3) employ, fix the salaries of, assign,
14	terminate or discharge all employees of the school district,
15	<u>except for certified personnel whose hiring or firing shall be</u>
16	approved or rejected by the local school board;
17	(4) prepare the school district budget based
18	on public schools' recommendations for review and approval by
19	the local school board and the department. The local
20	superintendent shall tell each school principal the approximate
21	amount of money that may be available for his school and
22	provide a school budget template to use in making school budget
23	recommendations; and
24	(5) perform other duties as required by law,
25	the department or the local school board.

		2	board for a waiver of certain provisions of the Public School
		3	Code relating to length of school day, staffing patterns,
		4	subject area or the purchase of instructional materials for the
		5	purpose of implementing a collaborative school improvement
		6	program for an individual public school."
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
