## AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL LAW: CREATING THE OFFENSE OF AGGRAVATED FLEEING A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER; PROVIDING PENALTIES; ENACTING A NEW SECTION OF THE CRIMINAL CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Criminal Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] AGGRAVATED FLEEING A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER. --

Aggravated fleeing a law enforcement officer A. consists of a person driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs, as provided in Section 66-8-102 NMSA 1978, and willfully refusing to stop the person's motor vehicle after being given a visual or audible signal to stop, whether by hand, voice, emergency light, flashing light, siren . 153899. 1

or other signal, by a uniformed law enforcement officer in pursuit of the person in an appropriately marked law enforcement vehicle.

Whoever commits aggravated fleeing a law B. enforcement officer is guilty of a fourth degree felony."

Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2005.
