SENATE BILL 426

has had it under consideration and reports same with recommendation that it **DO PASS**, amended as follows:

- 1. On page 1, line 18, after "program" insert "for immates with a history of opiate dependence".
- 2. On page 1, line 23, after the period insert "Priority shall be given to inmates approaching release into communities with operational methadone clinics.".
- 3. On page 2, line 5, after the period insert "The criteria shall be consistent with existing department of health guidelines.".
 - 4. On page 2, line 7, strike "and buprenorphine".
- 5. On page 2, between lines 8 and 9, insert the following new subsection:
- "E. The corrections department, in conjunction with the epidemiology and response division of the department of health, shall collect the following outcomes data:
- (1) recidivism of methadone-treated inmates versus counseling-only treated inmates;
- (2) positive urine drug screens among methadonetreated parolees versus counseling-only treated parolees, as followed by the adult probation and parole division of the corrections department;
- (3) the rates of newly acquired hepatitis B, hepatitis C, human immunodeficiency virus and methacillin-resistant
