RELATI NG TO MDTOR VEHI CLES; REQUI RI NG CHI LD BOOSTER SEAT USE FOR CERTAI N CHI LDREN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEG SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. Section 66-7-369 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1983, Chapter 252, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:
"66-7-369. CHI LD PASSENGER RESTRAI NT- - ENFORCEMENT. - -
A. A person shall not operate a passenger car, van or pi ckup truck in this state, except for an author emergency vehicle, public transportation or a school bus, unl ess all passengers less than ei ghteen years of age are properly restrai ned.
B. Each person less than ei ghteen years of age shall be properly secured in a child passenger restraint device or by a safety belt, unl ess all seating positions equi pped with . 155061. 1
saf et y belts are occupi ed, as foll ows:
(1) children less than one year of age shal I be properly secured in a rear-facing child passenger restraint devi ce that meets federal standards, in the rear seat of a vehicle that is equi pped with a rear seat. If the vehicle is not equi pped with a rear seat, the child may ride in the front seat of the vehicle if the passenger-side air bag is deactivated or if the vehicle is not equi pped with a deactivation switch for the passenger-side ai $r$ bag;
(2) children one year of age through four years of age, regardless of wei ght, or children who wei gh less than forty pounds, regardless of age, shall be properly secured in a child passenger restraint device that meets federal st andar ds; [ and]
(3) children five years of age through six years of age, regardless of wei ght, or children who wei gh less than si xty pounds, regardless of age, shall be properly secured in ei ther a child booster seat or an appropriate child passenger restraint device that meets federal standards; and
[(3)] (4) children [five] seven years of age through twel ve years of age shall be properly secured in a child passenger restraint device or by a seat belt.
C. A child is properly secured in an adult seat belt when the lap belt properly fits across the child's thi ghs and hi ps and not the abdomen. The shoul der strap shall cross
the center of the child's chest and not the neck, allowing the child to sit all the way back agai nst the vehicle seat with knees bent over the seat edge.
D. Paragraphs (3) and (4) of Subsection B of thi s section do not apply to passenger vans operated by child daycare centers licensed by the children, youth and families department.
[C.] E. Fail ure to be secured by a child passenger restraint device, by a child booster seat or by a safety belt as requi red by this section shall not in any instance constitute fault or negligence and shall not limit or apportion danages." - 3 -
