AN ACT

RELATING TO SPECIAL DISTRICTS; PROVIDING AUTHORITY TO THE SOIL  
AND WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION TO ESTABLISH A WATERSHED  
COORDINATOR POSITION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 73-20-31 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978,  
Chapter 175, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

"73-20-31. POWERS AND DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT AND  
COMMISSION.--

A. The supervising officer of any state agency or  
post-secondary educational institution shall, within the  
limitations of his budget and the demands of his agency or  
institution, assign staff or personnel, render special reports  
and undertake surveys or studies pertaining to soil and water  
conservation for the commission and the department as

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1 requested.

2 B. The department, with the advice of the  
3 commission, shall:

4 (1) assist districts in the development of  
5 district soil and water conservation programs and, from such  
6 programs, develop a soil and water conservation program for the  
7 state;

8 (2) provide information for supervisors  
9 concerning the experience and activities of all districts and  
10 facilitate the exchange of experience and advice among  
11 districts;

12 (3) promote cooperation between districts and,  
13 by advice and consultation, assist in the coordination of  
14 district programs;

15 (4) secure and maintain the cooperation and  
16 assistance of state and federal agencies and seek to secure and  
17 maintain the cooperation and assistance of national, state and  
18 local organizations and groups interested or active in natural  
19 resources conservation and development;

20 (5) disseminate information throughout the  
21 state concerning district activities and programs; and

22 (6) encourage and, within budget limitations,  
23 render assistance to district activities and facilitate and  
24 encourage the formation of new districts in areas where  
25 district organization is desirable.

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C. The commission may:

(1) advise the department and the board of regents concerning any matter that in its opinion has a significant impact on or otherwise substantially affects soil and water conservation; ~~and~~

(2) promulgate rules to carry out the provisions of the Soil and Water Conservation District Act; and

(3) establish a position for and appoint a watershed coordinator who will be responsible for:

(a) cooperative agreements between the state and the federal agencies, political subdivisions or Indian nations, tribes or pueblos;

(b) coordination of landowner agreements through the local soil and water conservation district;

(c) establishment of a clearinghouse for statewide watershed information in cooperation with the water resources research institute at New Mexico state university;

(d) use of the range improvement task force as the technical advisory group for watershed projects;

(e) increasing watershed education programs through the cooperative extension service and the soil and water conservation districts;

(f) expanding opportunities for biomass use and development; and

(g) continuing expansion of job

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1 development opportunities for watershed restoration projects."

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
