15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SHORT TITLESections 1
17	through 4 of this act may be cited as the "Family Preservation
18	Act".
19	Section 2. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] LEGISLATIVE PURPOSE The
20	purpose of the Family Preservation Act is to confirm the
21	state's policy of support for the family and to emphasize the
22	responsibilities of parents and the state in the healthy
23	development of children and the family as an institution. The

Section 3. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] FAMILY PRESERVATION GOALS--STATEMENT OF POLICY.--It is the policy of the state that its laws and programs shall:

A. support intact, functional families and promote each family's ability and responsibility to raise its children;

B. strengthen families in crisis and at risk of
losing their children, so that children can remain safely in
their own homes when their homes are safe environments and in
their communities;

C. promote the creation of well-paying, stable jobs so that families can provide for their basic needs, including health, education, food, clothing and shelter; and

D. help halt the breakup of the nuclear family, stabilize neighborhoods and strengthen communities.

Section 4. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] PARENTAL AND STATE RESPONSIBILITIES. - -

A. Parents have joint primary responsibility for the well-being of their family. Parents have the primary responsibility to:

(1) ensure that their children have adequatefood, shelter and health care and a healthy environment;

(2) support their children in all ways
